

10 Guards Leave Post In Britain

LONDON (UPI) — The War Office said today 10 of Queen Elizabeth's elite Coldstream Guards were absent from their barracks but it denied reports they were on a protest walkout.

British press reports said the men left the 2nd Battalion's Chelsea Barracks in London to protest extra drills and guard duties. A War Office statement called the reports "utterly without foundation."

The statement said that of 400 men who went on Easter leave from the 470-man battalion, "there are at the present time 10 who have not returned."

"With such large numbers involved it is inevitable that there will be individuals who are sick at home or who are remaining at home because of some domestic difficulty," the statement said. It said in such cases the battalion would be notified "in due course."

"To describe the absence of 10 men from a battalion nearly 500 strong after Easter leave as a protest walkout is clearly a misrepresentation of the facts," the War Office said.

The Daily Herald said today a contingent of Coldstream Guards left their quarters because of "conditions in general."

The Coldstream Guards is one of the most decorated battalions in the brigade of foot guards. It got its name in 1660 when members were mustered out of the border town of Coldstream and hurried 379 miles south to call Charles II back to the throne.

The Herald quoted one of the guardsmen as saying the men had complained about their food but that it was not improved.

Fish Law Appealed

THE DALLES (UPI) — A Yakima Indian convicted of illegal fishing is appealing the case to the State Supreme Court.

Lawrence Gowdy recently was found guilty by Circuit Judge Malcolm Wilkinson of using a set gillnet in the Columbia River near here. The state said that at the time of his arrest last July Gowdy was not fishing in accordance with federal regulations.

Dist. Atty. Don Turner contended the Yakima tribe sold some of its rights to Army Engineers when compensation was received for fishery loss in connection with construction of The Dam.

Gowdy's attorney, Tolbert H. McCarroll, Portland, said an 1855 treaty reserved for the Indians the right, as individuals, to take fish at "usual and accustomed places." He said the only possible way Indian fishing rights can be modified is by a showing of conservation need, and that this was not a factor in this case.

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Car Price Hike Predicted

DETROIT (UPI) — An industry-wide steel price increase probably would result in higher prices for 1964 model cars.

But the increase would not affect the prices of 1963 models, it was generally agreed.

Arguing against an immediate increase was the fact that the industry has been stockpiling steel as a hedge against a possible shut-down in the steel industry. While enough steel is not on hand to see the industry through the start of 1964 production, it was felt that the industry would absorb added steel costs through the end of this model year.

For one thing, car sales are at record levels and the major auto firms are reporting handsome profits this year. In addition, the industry traditionally does not change prices in the middle of a model year, preferring to wait until the new cars are introduced.

Auto prices have remained steady since 1953 and the companies have absorbed the cost of five wage increases in workers' salaries.

If the auto industry does increase its prices, the general consensus was that it would be about 2 per cent. The increase with the 1959 models was 2.6 per cent and the rough figure for any current hike would be about \$50 per car.

Snow-Bound Man Leaves Wife, Walks To Safety

MURPHY, Idaho (UPI) — David Sharpe, 40-year-old Gaway Junction man who along with his wife and son had been the objects of a search in the Weiser area since Monday, walked into the Owyhee County sheriff's office today after being stranded in a blizzard in the rugged Owyhee mountains.

Sharpe said he and his wife were stranded on a peak near Silver City. He said his wife, Retha, 40, still was in his car where it stalled Sunday afternoon.

His son, Delford, set out on foot

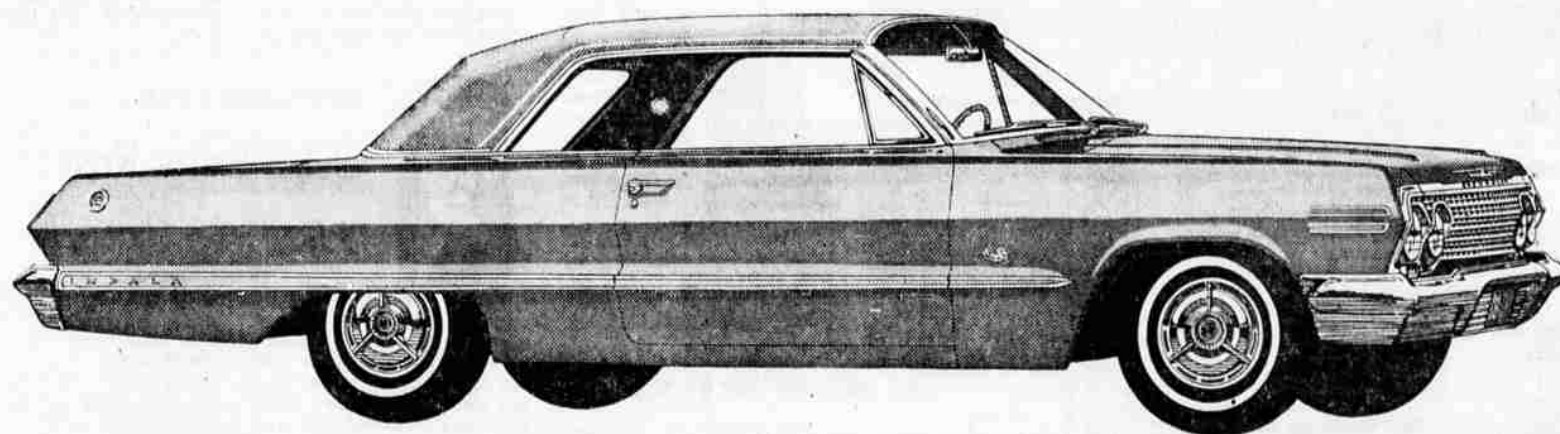
early Monday in an attempt to reach Jordan Valley across the snow-capped Owyhees. The boy has not been seen since.

The Owyhee County sheriff's office said it was organizing a jeep posse to break a trail to the car. An air and ground search began.

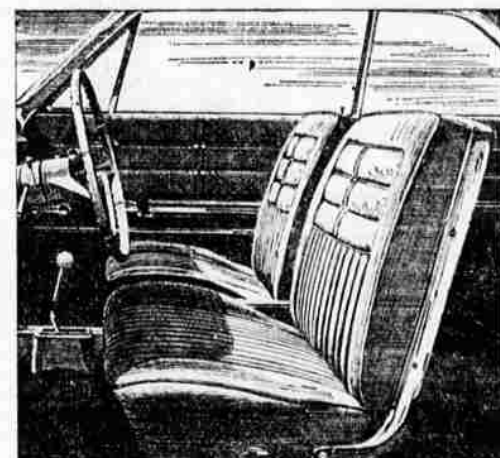
Meanwhile, Oregon authorities have been asked to join in the search for Delford Sharpe, deputies said.

The family was the object of a search in the Weiser area after it failed to return home Monday.

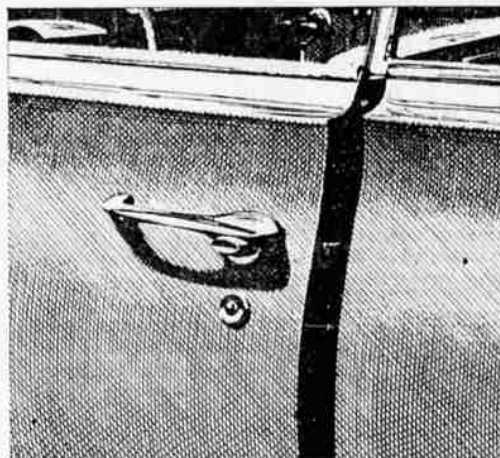
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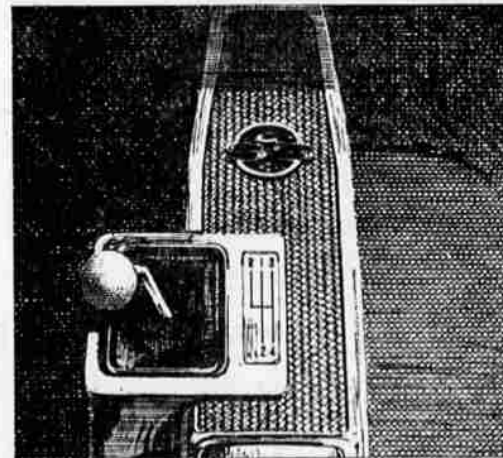

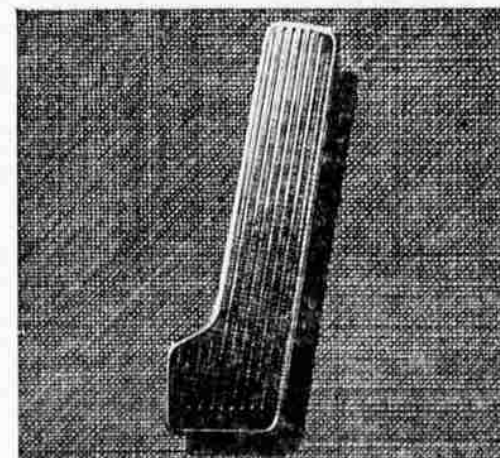

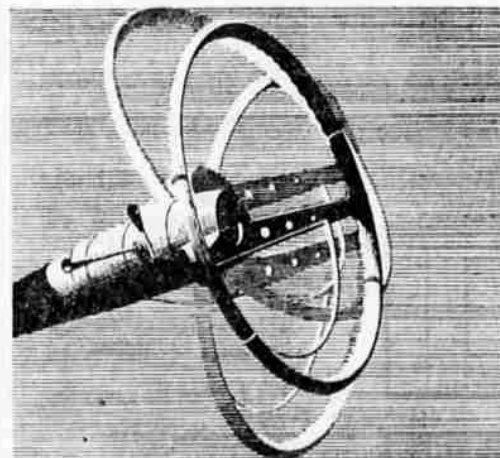
