A special prize in keeping with the topic of the luncheon will be offered. Reservations may be made by calling Mrs. Stan Neitling at TU 2-3332.

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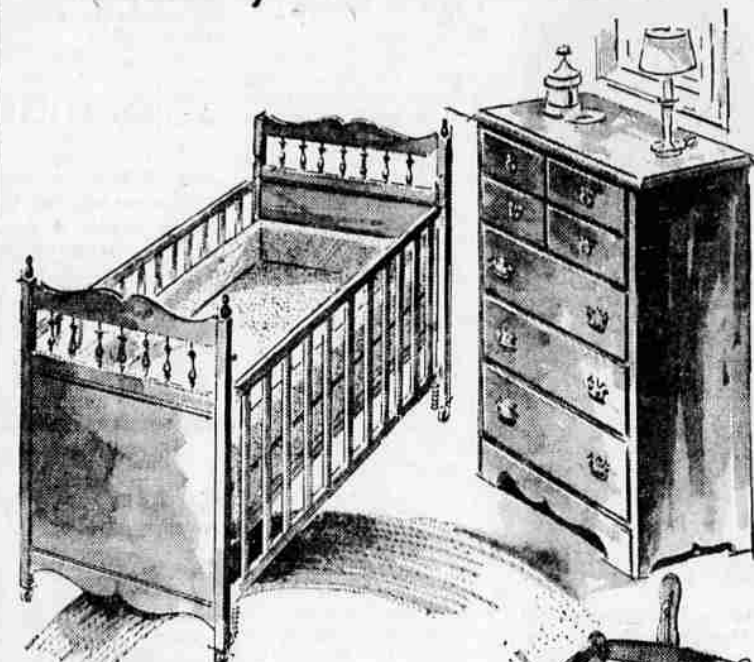


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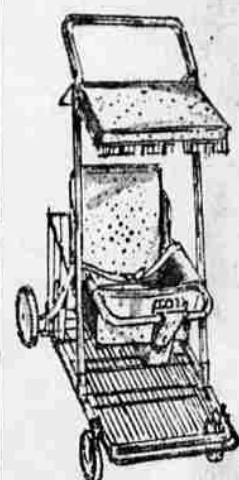
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
