Lakers, Celtics Ready

LOS ANGELES (UPI)—Another sellout crowd of more than 15,000 will jam the Sports Arena tonight to watch the sixth — and what may be the last — game of the National Basketball Association (NBA) championship series between the Los Angeles Lakers and the Boston Celtics.

With a 3-2 lead, the Celtics can wrap it up this evening and let old Bob Cousy retire on a triumphant note.

The Celtics could have won it all last Sunday on their home court but they faded in the final period and the Lakers came through with comparative ease, 126-119.

Tickets Sold Out

So the Boston champagne stayed on ice and the Celtics made another trek westward.

Should the Lakers win tonight and tie up the series, the teams will head East for what has to be the final game at Boston in the best-of-seven series on Saturday.

All tickets to this evening's contest were sold out before it was certain the game was to be held. Two theaters will welcome the overflow to watch the game on closed circuit television at \$2.50 per head.

The three days of rest after Sunday's game may mean more to the Celtics than the Lakers. Cousy, at 34, should have had enough time to recuperate and John Havlicek, the Boston rookie who sprained an ankle in the first championship game should be in top shape.

Home Court Advantage

Lakers' Elgin Baylor and Jerry West and the others will have what seems to be the advantage of playing on their home court and also the highly vocal support of the hometown crowd—to which they respond, according to Coach Fred Schaus.

Baylor and West combined to score 75 points in Sunday's victory and this was the first time the Lakers had won a road game since late in February.

In game No. 3 which the Lakers won 119-99 at the Sports Arena, Baylor and West totaled 80 points.

Third Round Of Tourney Underway

PINEHURST, N.C. (UPI)—The third round of the North-South amateur golf tournament got underway today with most of the favorites still in the running.

The major upset of the six-day tournament over the par-72, 7,000-yard Pinehurst Country Club course came Tuesday when New Yorker Bob Kuntz eliminated Walker Cup player Charlie Smith of Gastonia, N.C., 4 and 2.

Defending champion Billy Joe Patton won his second close match in as many days. The Morganton, N.C., furniture dealer was pressed to the 19th hole before downing John Ward of Fayetteville, N.Y., with a 10-foot putt.

Four quarterfinal matches will be held Thursday and the semifinals are scheduled Friday. The 36-hole finals will be played Saturday.

Other favorites including Bill Hyndman and Dale Morey won in the second round. Hyndman of Huntingdon Valley, Pa., an alternate Walker Cup team member, won easily over George Tomas of Durham 5 and 4 and Morey, a 1953 U.S. amateur runnerup, beat Pete Dye of Charlotte, 2 and 1.

Howard Leads LA Past Braves On Homer

Frank Howard finally has put on glasses and suddenly the Los Angeles Dodgers can see a much rosier future ahead.

Wearing the specs at bat for the first time Tuesday night, the 6-foot-7 Howard hammered a home run in the bottom of the ninth inning to break up a tie and give the Dodgers a 2-1 victory over the Braves.

Howard had considered putting on glasses for some time but did not decide to wear them until shortly before Tuesday night's contest.

From the point of view of the Dodgers, who have been having their troubles lately, the big outfielder couldn't have picked a better time.

Even though they won, the Dodgers still had their troubles. They collected only two hits, one off starter Bob Shaw and the other off loser Claude Raymond.

Koufax Injured

They also may have lost their ace southpaw, Sandy Koufax, for a while. Koufax, who was sidelined for half the season last year with a finger ailment, suffered a muscle spasm in his left shoulder Tuesday night and was forced to leave after blanking the Braves on two hits for 6 2-3 innings.

Sandy entrusted a 1-0 lead to Ron Perranoski, who nursed it until the top of the ninth when Hank Aaron cracked out his fifth homer of the season to tie the score.

And merely to make sure the game had everything, Milwaukee Manager Bobby Bragan announced the Braves were playing under protest in the third inning. Bragan got his dander up over two successive balks called on Shaw by plate umpire Augie Donatelli.

Giants Beat Reds

San Francisco beat Cincinnati, 4-2, Chicago defeated Pittsburgh, 7-2, and St. Louis crushed Houston, 15-0, in the other scheduled National League games.

In the American League, Baltimore nipped Minnesota, 1-0, Kansas City downed Detroit, 3-1, and Los Angeles edged Washington, 5-4, in 10 innings. Wet grounds caused postponement of the Boston-New York game.

Juan Marichal staved off a ninth inning rally by the Reds before wrapping up his second victory for the Giants on a six-hitter. Vada Pinson singled home Frank Robinson with one out in the ninth and Marichal then struck out both Leo Cardenas and Marty Keough. Jesse Gonder hit a pinch homer for the Reds in the eighth. Orlando Cepeda collected three of the Giants' 10 hits.

Southpaw Joe Nuxhall was the loser.

Homer Wrecks Pirates

Jim Shaffer's three-run homer off loser Don Cardwell capped a six-run fourth inning rally that clinched the Cubs' win over the Pirates. Larry Jackson struck out nine batters and gave up eight hits before a shivering "crowd" of 968, smallest to watch a game in Pittsburgh since 1943.

Ernie Broglio registered his second victory for the Cardinals with a two-hitter over the Colts and coasted home after his teammates built up a 7-0 lead by the fourth inning. The Cards bombed loser Jim Golden and three Colt relievers for 17 hits, including four by Bill White.
