

Saddle Larceny Charge Studied By Grand Jury

An indictment charging Everett Decker, 19, with the Jan. 21 larceny of saddles and personal property belonging to Francis Hutchinson of Beatty was resubmitted to the grand jury Tuesday, the circuit court has reported.

The grand jury convened early Tuesday and is expected to report to Circuit Court Judge David R. Vandenberg later this week.

Decker had been scheduled for trial on the larceny charge May 13 but the case was dismissed pending a further review of the indictment by the grand jury.

also indicted by the grand jury for the assault and battery of Hutchinson which occurred the same day as the alleged larceny. Decker, implicated on the two counts with four others, is scheduled for trial on the assault charge May 6.

Meanwhile in the circuit court of Judge Donald Piper, Sammy McKnight Jr., accused of the robbery of \$1,300 from a Lakeview man, changed his plea from not guilty to guilty after the district attorney's office reduced the charge from larceny to larceny from the person.

The former charge is punishable by a maximum sentence of 10 years imprisonment, while the maximum sentence for the latter crime is five years. Judge Piper set 10 a.m. Monday, April 29, as the time for sentencing.

The trial of Perry Chocknot, 30, and Wilbur Hickson, 42, charged with complicity in the larceny of a mare, was continued from Tuesday to Wednesday when illness kept Judge David R. Vandenberg away from the circuit court bench. The trial was slated to begin Tuesday with the selection of a jury.

A Problem In Defense

Here is another really tough hand from the intercollegiate tournament. North has a sound opening club bid and South is supposed to try for a slam via Blackwood. When North shows no aces South now gets a bidding par by either passing five clubs or going to five spades.

A spade lead and spade ruff defeats the five club contract right off the bat, but the directed play is against five spades and East and West must defeat this contract to gain their par for defensive play.

West is directed to open his singleton club, but actually he should make this lead without direction. He has heard the bidding, he holds at the ace of trumps and has every reason to believe that his partner has an ace also.

Declarer wins the club and leads a spade and no West must hold up his ace if he wants to get his par. Then on the second spade lead East should play the nine of hearts as a signal that he holds the ace of that suit. West wins the trick and leads a heart to East whereupon East returns the club and the hand is set.

If it looks silly to credit North and South for getting set when they could have made four spades had they stopped there, I want to remind you that people who sit on a bench never fall down, but they also never get anywhere.

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California Forked-Horn Deer Hunt Endorsed

NEW PINE CREEK — The Goose Lake Sportsmen's Club went on record at a meeting April 18 as giving full endorsement to the California Fish and Game Department's plan to legalize forked-horn deer for the 1963 season.

Garland Candiff reported on the recent Organized Sportsmen's meeting at Canby, which he attended with four other members of the local club. He said Walt Shannon, president of the Wild Life Federation, was present and encouraged the continuation of the three-point law, with a two-week shorter season, for a five-year trial period.

Verne King of the California Fish and Game Department said the final decision on the 1963 hunting laws will be made at the California WLF board of directors' meeting to be held April 27-28 in San Francisco.

Goose Lake members voted to send a letter stating the views of the club to William P. Elser, president of the California Game Commission, for presentation at the San Francisco meeting.

King, in briefing the club on fish plantings, said 61,500 fish are to be planted in Modoc County this summer.

There will be 21,750 rainbows; 20,500 eastern brooks; and 19,250 German browns. He explained that because of an infection at the Crystal Lake Hatchery, the department does not have a sufficient quantity of fish to stock the streams as planned. They now have a full-scale program in operation to eradicate the infection which seems peculiar to Crystal Lake and its drainage, he added.

Plantings will be distributed as follows: Annie Lake, 1,000 rainbows and 2,000 eastern brooks; Bishop Reservoir, 500 rainbows; Bidwell Creek, 1,000 rainbows; Broili Reservoir, 1,000 rainbows and 1,000 eastern brooks; Davis Creek, south fork, 250 rainbows; 250 eastern brooks; Lily Lake, 1,500 rainbows and 1,500 eastern brooks; Mill Creek, 500 rainbows; New Pine Creek, 500 German browns; Cave Lake, 1,000 fingerlings of mixed varieties; Jones Reservoir, 10,000 German brown fingerlings; Lassen Creek, 3,000 rainbows, and Fee Reservoir, 6,500 eastern brooks and 3,500 German browns.

Following the meeting, King showed a color film, "Flying Trout," illustrating the planting of fish from the air. Refreshments were served by Alvin Butler and Mrs. Rosetta Cloud.

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
