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LET'S CELEBRATE — Flaky cookies, ice cream and fruit, there are lots of combinations to make a delicious dessert for warm weather. Maybe a bit early for this extra good dessert but summer will come someday.

Deep Dish Cherry Pie

FILLING

1 cup sugar
1/2 teaspoon salt
2 teaspoons cornstarch
3 cups pitted red cherries
1 cup sifted flour

1/2 teaspoon salt
1-3 cup butter
3 tablespoons cold water
1 quart vanilla ice cream

Mix sugar, salt and cornstarch, and combine with cherries. Pour into well buttered shallow casserole. Sift flour, measure, and resift with salt. Cut in butter until coarse crumbs, size of rice are formed. Add water by teaspoons until mixture holds together, mixing with fork. Roll out to 1/4 inch thickness, and make gashes in a pattern; lay over cherries and pinch to sides of casserole. Bake in a hot oven, 450 degrees, for 20 to 25 minutes, or until crust is browned. Serv: warm or just cooled, with a large scoop of vanilla ice cream on each serving. Makes six to eight servings.

PARFAITS AND COOKIES

The name parfait lends glamour to the combination of ice cream and a topping which is commonly called a sundae. A tall, graceful parfait with layers of either fruits or sauces and ice cream is an eye-appealing finale to any meal.

Why not treat your family to this pleasure? No, special glasses aren't a necessity. Use any handy tall glass and create your own dessert parfait. Peaches and blueberries, raspberries, strawberries, cherries, crushed pineapple and mint jelly, or plain peaches combine well with vanilla ice cream. Perhaps you have another favorite flavor of ice cream you would like to use... or a variety of flavors in one is delicious.

Parfaits can be made ahead of time and stored in the freezer. Just before dinner, place them in the refrigerator to give them a chance to soften slightly.

Isn't there a tall glass in your cupboard that would take on new elegance when used to serve a parfait tonight?

FRESH FRUIT SAUCE

Fresh peaches, blueberries, raspberries, strawberries, and cherries make good parfaits. Wash the berries and drain. Peel peaches and pit, then slice. Pit cherries. Crush fruit only slightly. For each cup, stir in about 1/4 to 1/3 cup sugar. Combine crushed pineapple and mint jelly, blend well.

SURPRISE PASTRY COOKIES

1 cup butter (2 sticks)
1 cup small curd cottage cheese (1/2 pint)
2 cups sifted flour
1 egg, well beaten
1/2 cup sugar
1/4 teaspoon cinnamon, optional

1 cup finely chopped nuts

Cream butter and cottage cheese until smooth. Stir in flour. Shape dough into a ball and wrap in foil, saran or waxed paper. Refrigerate several hours. Roll 1/4-inch thick on a lightly floured board or canvas. Cut with 2-inch round cookie cutter. Place on ungreased cookie sheet. Brush tops with beaten egg. Mix sugar, cinnamon and nuts; sprinkle mixture over cookies. Bake in moderate oven, 350 degrees, until lightly browned, about 15 minutes. Makes 6 dozen cookies.
