

Ed Cecil Captures First Oregon Tech Open Decathlon Title

Ed Cecil, a stocky-built Oregon Tech trackman, won the First Annual Open Decathlon at the Mile High track Friday and Saturday by beating out a surprising second place finish of Bob Bryant by 255 points.

Cecil, who was the outstanding thinclad at the meet in Bend last week, compiled 4,307 points to 4,052 for Bryant, the thin little man who looks like anything but a decathlon competitor. John Maricich finished third with 3,602 points and Bob Chard fourth with 3,498 points. Kenny Lenhardt, the student coach of the track team,

was fifth with 3,328 points and Coach Larry Burleson was sixth with 2,647.

Dick Skinner, a student at OTT but not a track team man, was seventh with 2,175 points and Norm Johns finished eighth with 2,012 points despite having competed in only the first five events Friday. He failed to show up for the Saturday's last five events.

The decathlon, a grueling series of 10 events which test an athlete's skill and conditioning simultaneously, was open to all comers. But only athletes from the school and one downtown competitor took part. Athletes from Kingsley were slated to

take part but didn't show up. The five events run off Friday were the 100-yard dash, the broad jump, the high jump, the 330-yard dash, and the shot put. The Saturday events were the high hurdles, the pole vault, discus, javelin and three-quarter mile.

The Friday events were hampered some by a strong and brisk wind which was bad for running because of the cold. The 100-yard dash with Cecil, Bryant and Maricich running in the first heat, turned in the best time with Maricich winning in 9.9. Cecil was timed in 10 flat. Maricich took the broad jump laurels with a 19 - 2 leap

against the wind. Bryant was second with a leap of 18-4 and Bob Chard and Johns each leaped 16-2.

Coach Larry Burleson took shot put honors with little trouble. He heaved the 16-pound iron ball 45-3. Cecil was the only

one even reasonably close with a toss of 41 feet even. Chard tossed it 36-2.

The high jump proved to be one of the best efforts of the decathlon. Little Bryant, who stands only about 5-8 himself, won the event at 5-11. The bar was set at six feet but it measured out at 5-11. He was all alone. Burleson was second with a 5-4 leap and Johns and Skinner each cleared 5-2.

Cecil jumped back into the lead when he won the 330-yard dash in 40.3 despite the strong wind. Maricich was second in 40.7 and Bryant third in 42.9. Cecil finished the first day's events with a slim lead over

Bryant, Maricich and Johns and Chard.

The Saturday events were under good conditions but the assignments were a little bit tougher. Bryant jumped right back into the picture with a fine 12.3 clocking over the 90-yard high hurdles. Cecil was second in 13.1 and Ken Lenhardt third in 14.1.

Bob Chard came out first in the discus to gain points when he hurled the disc 131-6. Coach Burleson was second at 126-7. Cecil was third with a heave of 109-5.

The most difficult of all the events for all the competitors proved to be the pole vault.

Few had ever vaulted and the eight-foot minimum for scoring was a distant height for most. Chard surprised in this event and won it at nine feet. Skinner was the only other to clear the eight-foot minimum.

Cecil upset Chard in the javelin. Cecil heaved the spear 171-3 to beat Chard by a foot and two inches. Lenhardt was a surprising third with a throw of 147-8 and Burleson was fourth at 140-0.

The final event was won by Bryant in a clocking of four minutes flat in the three-quarter mile run. His time wasn't good enough to give him enough

points as Cecil finished fourth in 4:12 to wrap up the decathlon title. Maricich was second in 4:10 and Lenhardt third at 4:06.

More decathlons are planned this summer and anyone wishing to enter may do so. There is no age limit. Keep watching this paper for the dates and sites of such events.

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Stone Hurls Orioles Past Los Angeles, 4-2

BALTIMORE (UPI) — Reliever Dean Stone induced Felix Torres to hit into a game-ending double play with two men on base Saturday to preserve a 4-2 victory for young Dave McNally and the Baltimore Orioles over the Los Angeles Angels.

Jackie Brandt, who had a perfect day at the plate, hit his third home run of the year for the Orioles in the second inning and Joe Gaines added a homer in the third inning, both off Bo Belinsky. However, the Orioles scored what proved to be the winning runs in the eighth inning when Al Smith singled home Bob Johnson

and then Gaines came home when hits until he weakened in the ninth.

Then, after Albie Pearson led off the ninth with a single, Dick Hall relieved McNally and induced pinch-hitter Bob Sadowski to fly out. Stone replaced Hall and after yielding a single to Lee Thomas, he got Torres to ground into the game-ending double play.

McNally, who won his second game of the year and has yet to be beaten in three major league decisions, held the Angels to four

hits.

Ed Sadowski's eighth-inning home run accounted for both Los Angeles runs.

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Yankee Homers Rip Foe

NEW YORK (UPI) — Mickey Mantle returned to the New York Yankees' lineup for the first time in more than two weeks Saturday but Joe Pepitone, Tom Tresh and Cleve Boyer supplied the home runs that enabled Ralph Terry to defeat the Cleveland Indians, 8-1.

Pepitone and Tresh hit their homers off loser Dick Donovan with the bases empty while Boyer connected with the bases full off southpaw Ron Nischwitz in the eighth inning.

Pittsburgh Sneaks By Mets, 2-1

PITTSBURGH (UPI) — Southpaw Joe Gibbon came out of the bullpen Saturday and hurled a three-hitter to give the Pittsburgh Pirates a 2-1 edge over the New York Mets.

Gibbon, making his first start since last Aug. 21, was a last-minute replacement for Earl Francis who suffered a muscle spasm in a pre-game workout. The gangling left-hander was touched for a single by Ron Hunt and Gil Hodges and a double by Charlie Neal. He struck out six and the only run he yielded was unearned.

Twins Rap Error-Prone Tigers, 9-3

DETROIT (UPI) — The Minnesota Twins, capitalizing on shaky Detroit Tiger fielding, picked up seven unearned runs in the first five innings Saturday and went on to record a 9-3 American League triumph behind the hitting of Earl Battey who knocked in four runs.

Left hander Dick Stigman set down the Tigers on five hits and Jim Hall chipped in with a two-run third-inning double and Battey slammed a three-run fifth-inning homer to give him all the help he needed.

Race Track Job Draws Frowns

SALEM (UPI) — State Sen. Thomas R. Mahoney, D-Portland, objected Thursday to legislators or legislative employees working at race tracks.

Mahoney appeared before the Senate State and Federal Affairs Committee and said the practice should be halted.

State Sen. Tom Monaghan, D-Milwaukee, and Dale Henderson, Portland, Senate secretary, have part time jobs at Portland Meadows. Monaghan said he had the job before he went to the legislature and saw nothing wrong with it. He said it was necessary to be "on call" during the session to have a job when it is over.

House Speaker Clarence Barton commented, "I have no objection to it. It's a decision for the person involved, although I don't think it's good policy."

Marilyn Smith Takes Lead In Titleholder's Tourney

AUGUSTA, Ga. (UPI) — Marilyn Smith, a 36-year-old blonde from Jupiter, Fla., shot a three-under par 69 Saturday to move ahead of defending champion Mickey Wright in the 24th Women's Titleholders championship.

Miss Smith held a 34-hole total of 216—two strokes below the previous titleholders' record—and a three-stroke lead over Miss Wright who came in Saturday with a 73-219.

The attractive Miss Smith started Saturday's round one stroke behind Miss Wright who is seeking her third consecutive titleholders crown. Miss Smith bogeyed the

first hole but then, with some sensational putting, picked up four birdies over the next six holes and toured the front nine in two under par 34. She was four strokes under par after 12 holes and seemingly en route to tying the tournament record of 68 but bogeyed number 13 and then matched par the rest of the way home.

Miss Smith's performance almost went unnoticed until late in the afternoon since most of the attention had been focused on 19-

year-old Sandra Haynie of Fort Worth, Tex., who set a new record when she turned in a five-under par 31 on the front nine. However, she went to pieces on the back nine and finished with a 73-228 that left her 12 strokes off the lead.

Miss Haynie said her hot streak on the front nine contributed to her troubles on the back since "when I realized how well I was doing, I began to get the shakes and went to pieces."

Chicago Pops Phillies, 4-2

CHICAGO (UPI) — Larry Jackson scattered seven hits Saturday and drove in the winning runs with a two-base hit to give the Chicago Cubs a 4-2 victory over the Philadelphia Phillies, breaking a three game losing streak.

Jackson's only hit in three times at bat came with two out in the fourth and runners on second and third. Both Ernie Banks and Lou Brock scored on the drive to deep center field.
