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Beauty Briefs

A rosy complexion is high on the list of what's new for spring. Some women will need little or no make-up because of their naturally high color. Most of us, though, need help to attain the "pink" look decreed as a companion to spring fashion colors.

Cheek rouge is important. Learn to apply it properly and discretely for the best effect. Your cheek rouge should reflect the color of your lipstick. If you choose to wear a red, pink or orange dress or other clothes in the warm color range, you will need very little rouge. You will need more color if you wear green, blue or lavender.

Apply a fluid or cream-type rouge before you use compact or cake make-up. Apply the rouge to the highest part of your cheeks and blend it toward your ears with a damp - dry silk sponge. You will want to experiment to find the pattern that best suits your face.

Complete your make-up and put on your dress. Now check to see if you need more rouge. If you do, use dry rouge applied lightly.

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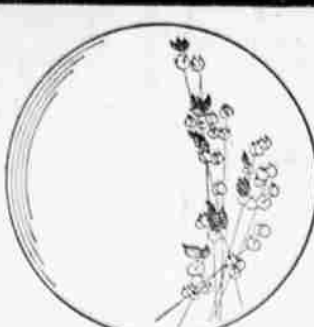
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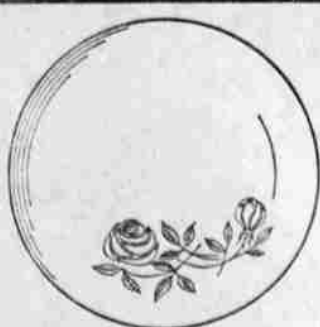
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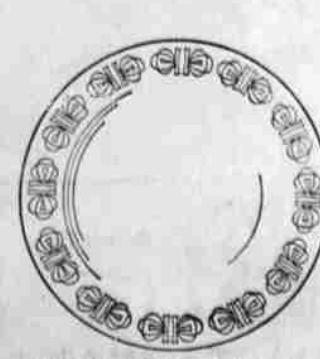
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
