Powder Pointers

Face powder is one of the keys to a flawless look. Puff it on properly and you will be as close to the velvety complexion we all want as anyone can get.

A clean puff is essential. Have a generous amount of powder on the puff. Start with the lower part of your cheek and puff the powder on gently clockwise around your face.
