

Instrumental Music Study Award Given

A new scholarship in the amount of \$100 annually for a student in the Klamath Union High School Instrumental Music Department has been presented by Dr. Arthur Compton, a local physician and surgeon.

Dr. Compton's scholarship is to be known as the KUHS Instrumental Music Award; LaMar K. Jensen, director of instrumental music, announced.

The award will be given annually in May to an outstanding instrumental music student registered in any regular KUHS music class. The award is for one year only and must be used to further the advanced instrumental music study of the winner, who will be chosen at a public competition recital to be held this year on May 7 at the Mills School Auditorium. All phases of the award will be administered by the KUHS music faculty.

Three judges will pick the winner of the competition, and their decision will be final. Neither Dr. Compton nor the music department will have any voice in the decision made by the judges.

Arrangements are being made to provide outstanding musicians from Southern Oregon to act as judges, and these judges will be announced in the near future. It is anticipated that some of the most talented and outstanding string and wind instrument performers of Klamath Union High School will participate in this award.

4-H Summer School June 10

The annual 4-H Club Summer School will be held at Oregon State University, Corvallis, June 10 to 15, according to Bev Bower and Francis Skinner, county extension agents.

Four-H Club members must have been 13 years old before Jan. 1, have completed a year of 4-H work, be presently enrolled in 4-H, and have been selected to represent his county to attend 4-H. Applications are available at the 4-H office and

are due May 6. Four-H Club Summer School is the occasion when some 1,900 4-H'ers from every county of Oregon meet on the Oregon State University campus and attend classes in a variety of subjects. They range from highway safety to good grooming and from agricultural classes for boys to home economics classes for girls. Besides classes, sports, swimming, recreation and parties are available.

Leadership opportunities for older club members are provided in special class selection. These include leadership, communications, camp counseling, how we live in America, money matters, music and art appreciation, leadership in group singing, medical self-help, home economics—a career for you, food engineering science, town and country business, animal, plant, forest, fish and game sciences.

Rusk Warns About Reds

KARACHI, Pakistan (UPI) — Secretary of State Dean Rusk said today the major threat from Cuba has been removed but he warned that "all members of the Free World are still under the gun" of communism.

Rusk said defensive arrangements such as the North Atlantic Treaty Organization and the Central Treaty Organization are the most effective way to keep world peace and prevent war by error.

He told a meeting of the CENTO ministers that only behind a shield of defense can the Free World pursue economic progress that will ensure lasting peace.

"Today our security of the Free World depends not on the distance from the enemy but on the certain knowledge by an aggressor of a devastating response to an attack," he said.

The meeting was opened by the Pakistani host foreign minister, Zulfikar Bhutto, who reminded the delegates of his government's concern over Western arms shipments to India for use against Communist Chinese aggression.

A door knob at the vacuum center was pried off, but a locking bar on the other side of the door prevented entry by the would-be thief.

Police failed to get any information from the owner concerning a suspect. The attempt occurred late Sunday night or early Monday Morning.

Parks' vehicle is a 1959 blue Volkswagen bearing Oregon license number 1P-933.

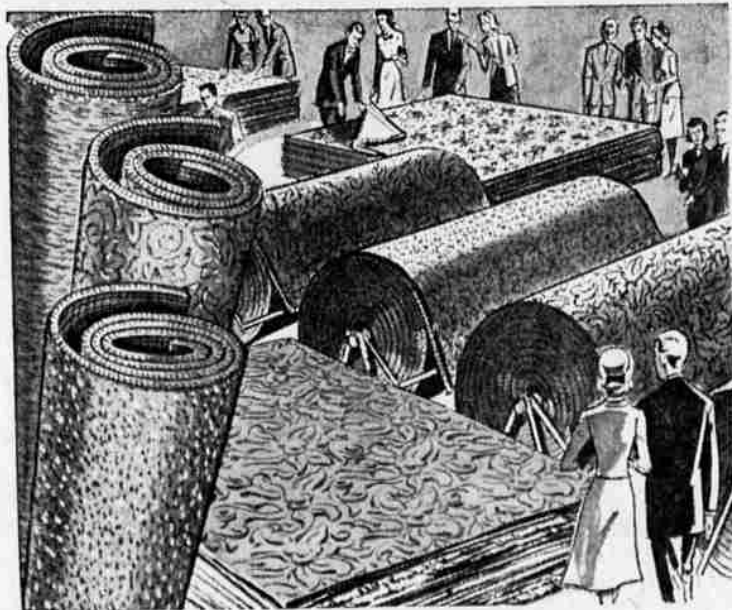
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
