Box 941. Mail entries must be postmarked not later than 5:30 p.m. Tuesday, and entries must be deposited in the COINWORD contest boxes by 12:00 noon Wednesday.

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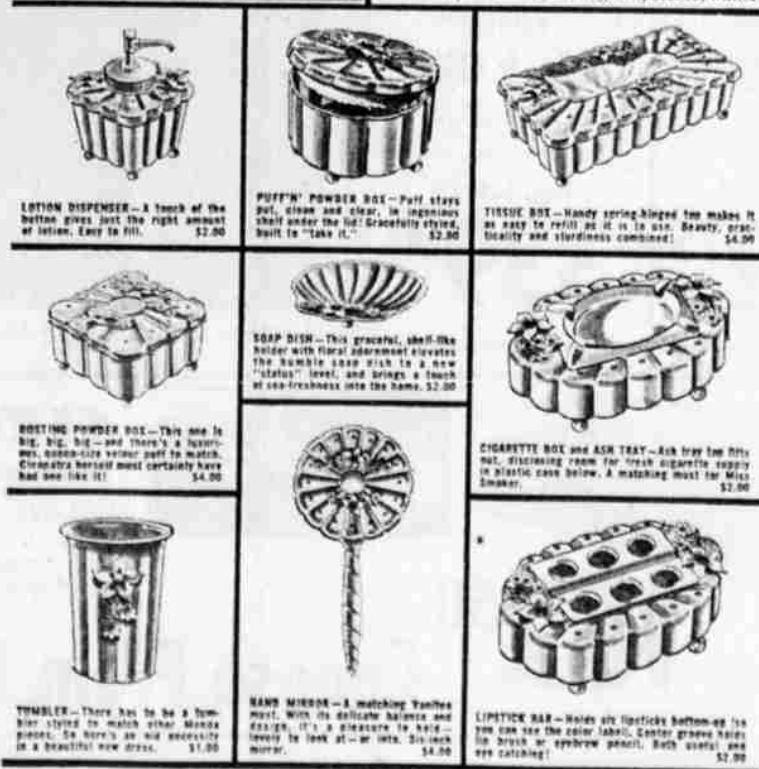
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
