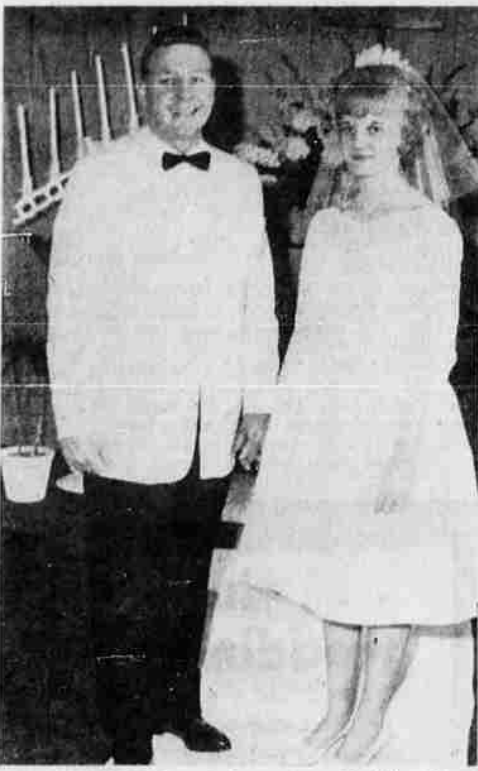

This convention will be held May 8 and 9 at the Eugene Hotel with the Eugene Federated Women's Club as hostess club. Other clubs of the Second District will assist. Mrs. Jack W. Steward, president of the Eugene club, is general chairman.

Here for the convention will be Mrs. William H. Hasebrook, West Point, Neb., first vice president of the General Federation of Women's Clubs, and Mrs. Earl J. Hazleton, Orland, Calif., chairman of leadership mobilization for GFWC. These women will speak and on May 9 will lead in the discussions at work shops. Mrs. Hasebrook, who is also president of the National Association of Parliamentarians, was in Oregon last fall visiting units of the national association.

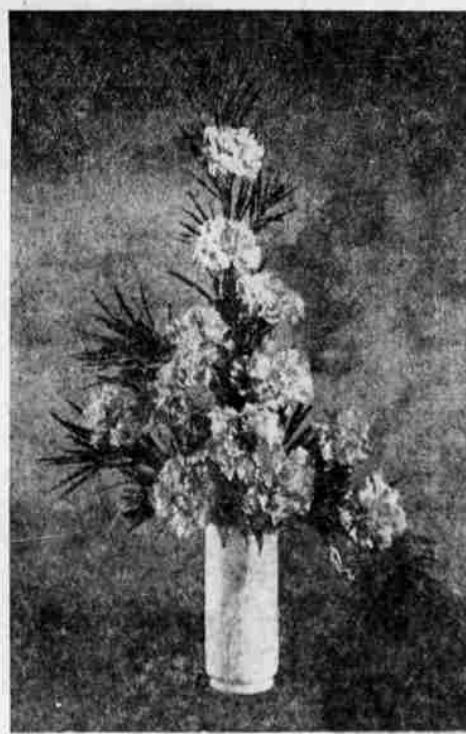

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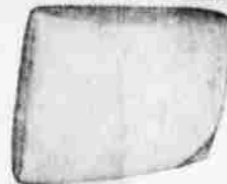
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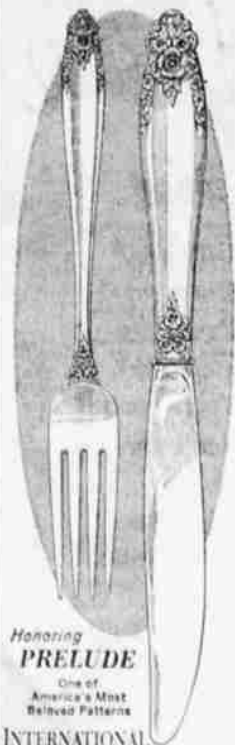
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
