In Europe a lady does not clean her own home, much less go out and clean up somebody else's dirt for a few dollars. The picture in my mind of Her Ladyship with dust rags and a broom is like a comic opera. My American neighbors refer to a woman who sells hairnets in the dime store as a saleslady.

Yesterday when my husband and I drove into a parking lot the man said, "Just leave the keys in your car. The lady will take care of it." A person in tight pants came up and that was "the lady."

In Europe a lady doesn't scrub floors, sell hairnets or park cars. Work is beneath her dignity. What does "lady" mean here?—SWISS MRS.

Dear Mrs.: In America we also have people who think work is beneath their dignity. They are called loafers.

The notion that work is for slobs is hopelessly outmoded—even in Europe. All work has dignity and merit if it is well done.

Dear Ann Landers: Our 16-year-old daughter sent for your booklet entitled "Necking and Petting and How Far To Go." She said it was the best 20 cents she had ever spent.

Negro Asks Explanation

OXFORD, Miss. (UPI)—Negro James Meredith has challenged University of Mississippi students to explain why they resent his presence on the campus.

Meredith addressed the students in an open letter in the campus newspaper Friday and questioned their attitude toward him. He said he had tried not to offend anyone since he enrolled Sept. 30, 1962. He was greeted with a bloody riot that left two persons dead and scores injured.

"My desire to attend this school was motivated primarily by the idea of securing greater educational opportunities for myself and my people," Meredith said. He added that he was not concerned with the phenomena of integration and segregation.

"White students can aspire to become prominent in almost any field of study, but the Negro at best can expect only in get a teaching certificate."

Mark Signs Relocation Pay Measure

Governor Hatfield has signed into law a legislative act permitting the State Highway Department to pay, within certain limits, the moving costs of persons displaced by highway construction. Passage of the bill had been requested by the State Highway Commission.

State Highway Engineer Forrest Cooper pointed out that prior to enactment of this bill Oregon was powerless to pay relocation costs even though permitted to do so by the Federal Highway Act of 1962. He said at least 18 states are now making relocation payments as provided under the federal law.

Any occupant of an improved property will be eligible for reimbursement of his necessary moving expenses if he is in occupancy at the time the state commences its acquisition procedures. No occupant who takes up tenancy after that time will be eligible. The Highway Department will pay actual costs up to a maximum of \$200 in the case of an individual or family, and up to \$3,000 in the case of a business or farm.

Cooper stated that the new law supplements the Highway Department's advisory assistance program which has been in existence since passage of the Federal Highway Act.

Highway officials anticipate that nearly all eligible persons will apply for relocation payments, with the bulk of claims expected from the Portland metropolitan area. Current and future freeway routes in Portland will displace a number of businesses and several hundred individuals in the next few years.

Persons eligible for relocation payments will be advised by representatives of the Highway Department well in advance of the time they must move. Information on the new program is available through the office of the Relocation Supervisor, Right of Way Division, State Highway Building, Salem.

MONTREUX, Switzerland (UPI)—Billy Graham's teen-age daughter Virginia, a bride of less than 24 hours, set off with her husband Saturday for a Mediterranean honeymoon.

"Gigi" Graham — now Mrs. Stephen Tchividjian — slipped quietly away from her father-in-law's house Saturday morning with her 23-year-old husband, heir to one of Switzerland's largest fortunes.

The couple left in a chauffeur-driven car. Relatives refused to say where they were headed.

The American evangelist told newsmen Friday they were planning to honeymoon "on the shores of the Mediterranean" and it was believed Israel would be one of the countries they would visit.

The young couple danced until well past midnight at a private dinner given by the bridegroom's father, Armenian-born financier Ara Tchividjian, at his luxurious mansion overlooking Lake Geneva and the snow-capped Alps.

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
