

American Dependents Ordered To Leave Haiti

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The United States Tuesday ordered all dependents of U.S. government personnel to leave Haiti. It also urged evacuation of private American citizens there.

An airlift of chartered commercial air liners started the evacuation Wednesday morning from Port-au-Prince, the Haitian capital to Miami, the State Department said.

The State Department said, "The continued deterioration of the situation in Haiti and the difficulty of insuring the lives and safety of U.S. citizens led to the department's decision to order the withdrawal of U.S. citizens."

M. Simons Death Told

Word has been received of the death of Mark Simmons, 55, formerly of Klamath Falls, Simons died Wednesday, April 24, in a San Jose hospital following a brief illness.

An attorney in Nebraska and Klamath Falls, Simons was in the real estate and insurance business in San Jose, where he had resided for the past nine years.

Funeral services were held in the Oak Hill Mortuary Chapel of Roses on April 27, with interment in the Oak Hill Memorial Park, San Jose.

Survivors include his wife, Mrs. Dorothy Simmons, San Jose; two sons, Mark Jr., Paris, France, and Charles E., Citrus Heights, Calif.; brother, Irvin, San Jose, and two grandchildren.

Fishing Boats Called Threat

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Sen. Edward M. Kennedy, D-Mass., warned today that super Russian trawlers harvesting traditional U.S. fishing grounds were "as real and immediate" a threat as a Soviet collective farm in Iowa.

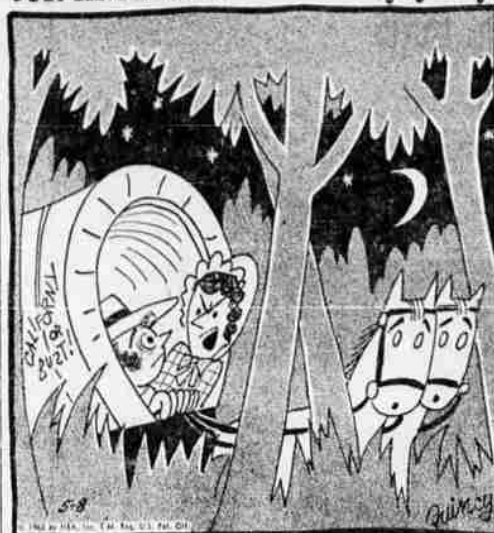
Kennedy urged passage of a \$125 million, 10-year subsidy program for building fishing boats to compete against the Russians who, he said, have invaded the North Atlantic in "massive numbers" and have spread their activities along all U.S. coasts.

In a prepared statement in behalf of himself and Sen. Leverett Saltonstall, R-Mass., Kennedy told a Senate commerce subcommittee that "the future of our fishing industry is at stake."

The subsidy bill was given a fair chance to get through Congress this year.

Missile Scientist Dies

EL MONTE, Calif. (UPI) — Dr. Theodore von Karman, 81, honored as the scientist responsible for modern missile triumphs, died Tuesday at Aachen, Germany.

He was chairman of Aeronautics at the University of California, Los Angeles, and was awarded international honors for scientific achievement and edited books on aerodynamics.

Death was attributed to a heart attack and complications of pneumonia.

Von Karman, famed aerodynamicist, was director of the Guggenheim Aeronautical Laboratory in Pasadena, Calif., from 1938-1949. He was chairman of NATO's advisory group for aeronautical research and development at the time of his death and spent much of his time in Europe on this project.

Dan A. Kimball, president of Aerojet General, described Von Karman as a "scientist's scientist and an engineer's engineer."

Kimball said the aerodynamicist "fathered the transition from winged flight to jet propulsion and pioneered new methods in the study of fluid mechanics and hydrodynamics."

Kimball said during a laboratory dedication ceremony two years ago that the works of Einstein and Von Karman were what "assured our security in the 20 years since Pearl Harbor."

Von Karman was born in Budapest, Hungary, May 17, 1891. He studied both in Budapest and Germany where he earned many honorary degrees.

He served as director of the Aeronautical Institute at the University of Aachen from 1912-1929.

Bill Signed

SALEM (UPI)—The fourth and final bill in a package revising commercial fishing licenses and fees was signed into law Monday by Gov. Mark Hatfield.

The commercial fishing industry endorsed all four bills before the legislature.

These are the signed package: SB288—Consolidates fish processor and dealer licenses and increases fees.

SB319—Revises commercial fishing licenses and increases fees.

SB368—Increases poundage fees on food fish and shell fish and revises reporting requirements.

EUGENE (UPI) — The Lane County grand jury Friday indicted Albert Rowland, 48, Springfield, on a charge of first degree murder.

Rowland, a former patient at the Oregon State Hospital, is charged with fatally stabbing Chester Fish, 32, Eugene, April 16. He is being held in jail here without bail.

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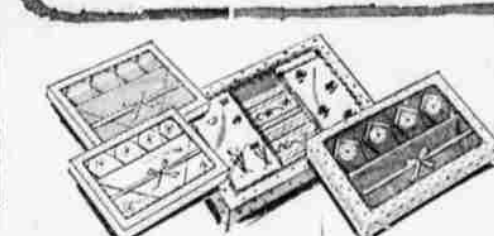
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
