Senate Group Still 'Considering' House-Approved Income Tax Bill

SALEM (UPI) — Today, the 116th day of the legislative session, the Senate Tax Committee is still going through the motions of "considering" the House-approved income tax bill. It's a sham.

The committee members know full well what the House program includes — and what's more important, they know they aren't going to buy it.

That's why Gov. Mark Hatfield, at his Monday news conference, warned of the dangers of a "conference committee" to iron out differences.

The House has sent its bill to the Senate. The Senate will make amendments that undoubtedly will not win approval in the House.

Then House Speaker Clarence Barton and Senate President Ben Musa will appoint a "conference committee" which will meet until it reaches some kind of agreement.

Because of the nature of such last minute give-and-take sessions, the results will not satisfy anyone.

That's why Hatfield termed the process "the poorest way to draft a tax program."

Hatfield also termed conference committees "a horrible legislative procedure."

He wasn't addressing his remarks at the Senate Tax Committee. He was speaking to the public.

Hatfield suggested that Senate Tax Committee Chairman Boyd Overhulse, D-Madras, invite the House Tax Committee to meetings to iron out differences as a way to avoid a conference committee.

The governor knows the Senate bristles at such suggestions.

The Senate Tax Committee is just as jealous of its role as is the House.

Duke Of Argyll Sheds Wife In Flaming Suit

EDINBURGH, Scotland (UPI) — The Duke of Argyll, 60, chief of the Clan Campbell and hereditary master of the queen's household in Scotland, was granted a divorce today after the judge disclosed the beautiful duchess had been photographed in the nude with another man.

The divorce was granted on grounds the 50-year old duchess, a strikingly beautiful woman, had committed adultery with a hotel press agent.

The duke had accused his wife of committing adultery with four men, including an American businessman described in court by the judge as "a self-confessed wolf" who "admitted having the morals of a tomat."

The decree was handed down by Justice John Wheatley in a marathon decision which revealed for the first time since the trial last month some of the most sensational evidence produced in a British divorce hearing since the war.

The duke had charged his wife with adultery with an unnamed man with whom she posed in nude photographs and with three named men—Baron Sigmund von Braun, brother of rocket expert Werner von Braun; American businessman John Conane, 55, who now lives in Ireland, and Harvey Peter Combe, Savoy Hotel press agent.

The justice ruled that the duke had not condoned his wife's affair with Cobane, the "self-confessed wolf," in a New York hotel suite Jan. 13, 1956.

But he granted the actual divorce on the ground that the duchess, mother of the Duchess of Rutland, had been intimate with Combe.

Justice Wheatley, who took three hours and 20 minutes to read his 65,000 word verdict, reserved decision on the question of legal costs which are estimated to be among the highest of the century in the series of legal actions—\$140,000.

The duchess, who had denied the charges, is expected to appeal. Combe also had denied intimacy.

House Okays Study Bill For Cities

SALEM (UPI) — A new tool for metropolitan areas to use in trying to cope with their own problems was approved 46-14 today by the House.

The bill for creation of metropolitan study commissions went to the Senate.

It would apply now to Portland, and if they wanted, to Salem and Eugene. Any other city growing to a population of 25,000 would come under it then.

Rep. John Mosser, R-Beaverton, and Rep. Richard Kennedy, D-Eugene, called it this session's most important bill dealing with local government.

Mosser said its philosophy is that citizens of cities and suburbs can best solve their own problems.

The commission members would be drawn from an area 10 miles in radius from the heart of a city. Legislators of that area would appoint the commission members.

The commission's "teeth" would be in its power to put recommendations for annexation, consolidation, or two-thirds vote on the ballot by a two-thirds vote.

Mosser said in 1961 there were 504 special local districts of one kind or another in Oregon, more than twice the number in 1951 and more than five times 1941.

He said "it is the legislature that has authorized this proliferation of districts," and now it is the legislature that should provide a new tool for solving some of the problems they have created.

Opponents, many from less populated areas, called the bill unnecessary and said the legislature should not step into such a new area.

Woes Faced By Fishers

WASHINGTON (UPI)—A governor, fishermen and senators said Tuesday the American fishing industry is swamped by financial woes and faces extinction unless congress baits it out.

A score of witnesses paraded before the Senate Merchant Marine and Fisheries subcommittee supporting an administration-backed \$125 million 10-year program of fishing boat subsidies.

They said that Russian trawlers and other foreign, state-built, modern fleets are harvesting traditional American fishing grounds on both coasts in alarming numbers. American fishermen have difficulty financing new boats and are unable to compete, they said.

Kennedy Doll Ready For Sale

LOS ANGELES (UPI) — A new Japanese-made doll, a foot-high likeness of President Kennedy sitting in a wooden rocking chair, goes on the market next month.

The spring-wound toy, which has a wardrobe ranging from a football uniform to a full-dress tuxedo, will sell for about \$6.95.

When you wind it up, the doll rocks and plays the tune "Happy Days Are Here Again."
