The boathouse and a completely stocked store will be open as soon as the work is completed.

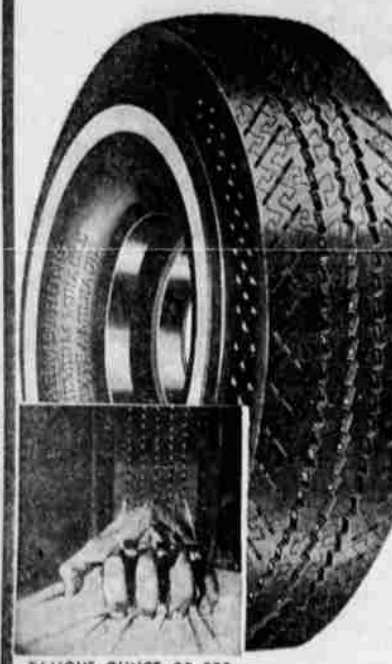
The cabins, lodge, and dining room are expected to be open for Memorial Day weekend.

MERRILL—The Henley Hornets won their second baseball game in as many days against the Tulalake Honkers here Thursday, capitalizing on bases on balls, stolen bases and errors for a 5-2 victory.

The Hornets scored three runs in the second inning as nine batsmen came to bat. LeVay Young led off with a walk and then, in order, stole second and third base and cashed in on the first Hornet run when Earl Allbritton got aboard on an error by the Honkers' first baseman. Gary Durfee fled out to left and Mike Beymer followed by ripping a double to centerfield. Al Grant was hit by a pitched ball to load the bases.

Randy Lapo then hit a sharp grounder to the Honker shortstop who then threw the ball high over home plate to allow Allbritton to score the second Hornet run. Beymer, in an attempt to score from second base, was out at the plate as Grant and Lapo went to third and second. Grant then

played the third run on a Tatum wild pitch. Steve Rand was hit by a pitch and Jon Crume walked to load the bases again before Steve Reffling grounded out.

Tulalake's Mike Todd scored the game's first run in the first inning with an error, stolen base and wild pitch. The Honkers' second run came when Mike Ganger opened the sixth with his second hit of the day and advanced to third on infield outs and scored on a Crume wild pitch.

Young walked in the third inning and scored the fourth Henley run as a result of an error and fielder's choice. In the sixth, Reffling's double to deep centerfield scored Lapo who had walked and stole second base.

Ex-Coach, Frank Ramsey, To Speak At K Club Fete

Frank Ramsey, former KU coach, pro football player, all-American and successful businessman, will be the featured speaker Saturday night at the annual K Club banquet to be held at Reames Country Club.

The fete is for members and guests only, but Jim Johnson said that former players under Ramsey and friends could call him for reservations at the school.

The banquet begins at 6:30. The fete will be followed by a dance in the Reames ballroom.

Ramsey was nominated to the Silver Anniversary All-America Sports Illustrated magazine in 1962. He played his college football at Oregon State. He was a center in his first two years, but his size and speed was recognized and he moved to guard.

Ramsey came to Klamath Union to coach in the 1938-39 school year. He left after one year and went to Corvallis where he stayed from 1939-1942. He then returned to KU in the fall of 1942 and coached the football team to the state championship. The Pelis were runners up in state the following year and won the basketball crown under Ramsey in 1943. He was in the Marines in 1944-45.
