

Fire Control Men Observe Water Bombing Techniques

The technique of bombing fire with water dropped from an airplane was demonstrated to approximately 30 fire control men of Northern California and Southern Oregon at Klamath Lake this afternoon, after the group had completed its one-day annual meeting at the Willard Hotel.

The demonstration employed the use of Lison Aircraft's PBV air tanker, equipped to scoop water from the lake while in flight and drop it on forest fires.

The show was slated for a site near Cove Point.

Participants attending the meeting represented the Bureau of Land Management offices at Lakeview, Medford and Redding; California Division of Forestry; Civil Defense Office at Yreka; Crater Lake National Park; Fremont National Forest; Klamath Lava Beds National Monument; Modoc National Forest; North Zone dispatcher at Redding; Rogue River National Forest; Six Rivers National Forest; Six Rivers National Forest; Oregon State Board of Forestry; U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service at Tulelake; Weather Bureau offices at Salem, Medford and Portland; USFS offices at Portland; and the Winema National Forest.

The Winema Forest and the Klamath National Forest were co-hosts of the meeting which featured panel discussions at the hotel this morning.

KUHS Opens Registration For Summer

Pre-registration is now in progress, and will continue until May 31, for 1963 summer school classes at Klamath Union High School. Classes are scheduled for Monday through Friday, June 6 to July 31, from 8 to 11:15 a.m.

Biology and American problems and government will be taught as full credit courses. The fee for each of these courses will be \$25.

Personal typing will carry one-half credit and will meet for ninety minutes each day. English for the freshman through the senior year, Algebra 4 and Math I will be offered as make-up courses. Students making up a credit in these subjects will enroll for a single ninety-minute period. The fee for the personal typing and make-up courses will be \$13.

Classes begin at 8 o'clock each morning, with the first break at 9:30. The second period will begin at 9:45 and will continue until 11:15. Students may register in Room 219 at the high school during regular school hours. A \$5 deposit will be required at the time of registration, with the remainder due on the first day of class. League Told Opposition

At the May 15 meeting, Dr. Cliff Robinson spoke to the Klamath County Taxpayers' League concerning the proposed consolidation into a single county unit district.

"The position of the Klamath County School Board," stated Dr. Robinson, "is to oppose this consolidation."

The county school board proposes and alternate plan and looks with favor on accepting some students, provided the territory where they reside is changed from the Klamath Union High School District to the Klamath County School District.

In another part of the meeting, reports concerning firemen's work hours, vector control, the net receipts tax and current school problems were heard.

Two amendments to the league's constitution were explained. These are to be voted on at the next meeting.

A nominating committee, composed of Andy Giger, H. C. Heard and Clarence Groves, was appointed to present a slate of new officers at the next meeting.

Paint Work Halts Travel On Overpass

Effective Monday, the new overpass at Washburn Way and Laverne Avenue will be closed from 10 days to two weeks to permit sand blasting and painting of the structural steel on the bridge, according to Jim Gix, resident bridge engineer of the State Department of Highways.

While the work is in progress, traffic which would flow over the overpass will be diverted via Laverne Avenue, Altamont Drive, Johns Avenue and finally to Washburn Way.

Soon after the painting is completed, and guard rails are installed, the County Road Department will begin paving both approaches to the overpass, Asst. County Engineer Winston Kurth said Friday. Kurth stated the paving project will be completed within the next 30 days.

The overpass, which spans the Great Northern Railway freight yards, was completed by a Roseburg construction firm last October, when the County Road Department began depositing the first of more than 18,000 truck loads of fill used to form the two approaches to the structure. It was open to traffic for the first time April 12.

Devil Pups Screen 31

The Devil Pup screening committee headed by Capt. John Matthews, Klamath Falls Fire Department, met this week to consider some of the 31 applications from area boys to attend the Devil Pup Marine camp at Camp Pendleton, Calif., for two weeks this summer.

Ten boys will be selected to attend the session sponsored jointly by the Marine Corps and the Klamath Falls Marine Corps League.

Another screening session will be called soon to make the final selection. Six local youths attended the session last year and the program has been received so well that the league decided to try and send more boys to the camp each succeeding year.
