Nixon Withholds Comment On Republican Presidential Race

CHICAGO (UPI) — Former Vice President Richard M. Nixon said Thursday he will not support any of the men mentioned as candidates for the 1964 Republican presidential nomination "until the proper time."
Nixon told a news conference that "it would be premature for me to make a choice now."
"Since my move to New York, there has been speculation that I am supporting Gov. (Nelson A.) Rockefeller in 1964," Nixon said. "Others have suggested I might be involved in a (George) Romney draft or a stop Goldwater movement."

"I want to make it clear that I am not participating in any campaign," Nixon said.
He said all three men would make good presidents, and "there are others to be considered, too."
Nixon held a news conference after conferring for an hour and 40 minutes with Illinois Secretary of State Charles F. Carpenter, regarded as the strongest Republican in the state. Carpenter has said he is a "possible" candidate for Illinois governor. Nixon said he called on Carpenter to discuss "a legal matter."
A reporter asked Nixon how he was getting along with his neighbor, referring to Rockefeller. Nixon on has moved into the building where Rockefeller lives in New York City.
"We don't use the same elevator, so I'm not too well acquainted with him in that regard," Nixon said.
Asked if Rockefeller's remarriage might hamper the governor's political plans, Nixon said, "I will not comment on that because it is a personal matter."

Nixon said the top issues for the 1964 presidential campaign are still to be decided. But if the campaign were in progress now, he said, the big issues would be Cuba and unemployment.
"The administration's policy in Cuba is to do nothing," Nixon said. "Castro will be in Cuba as long as he lives, and Cuba will be Communist forever if this policy continues."
He said the risk of war is less now than it will be six months from now, and urged an immediate change in the Kennedy foreign policy.

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
