Hornets Lose Rogue Title After Two-Year Tenure

The Henley Hornet baseball team finished its season last week-end with a 10-3 record and lost their Rogue League title for the first time in three years. But despite this, the Hornets had some good marks.

The team was led by junior shortstop LeVoy Young who swatted 333 with the exception of pitcher Randy Lapo who had four hits in nine at bats for a .444 average. He was walked seven times. Earl Allbritton, Ben Stoehsler and Bob Grant all hit .333.

The team finished with a so-so .261 team batting average, far below the Hornets' usual mean. Lapo won three games and lost none to pace the pitchers, but

also led the team in runs with 17, walks with 11 and tied for the RBI title with 10.

Young was the only hitter above .333 with the exception of pitcher Randy Lapo who had four hits in nine at bats for a .444 average. He was walked seven times. Earl Allbritton, Ben Stoehsler and Bob Grant all hit .333.

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Laszlo Papp Defeats Sandy

VIENNA (UPI) — Laszlo Papp of Hungary, unbeaten middleweight champion of Europe, entered his bid Saturday for a shot at the world crown because of his easy 10-round victory over American Randy Sandy here Friday night.

Thirty-seven-year-old Papp, the only professional fighter in any Communist country, announced that he wanted a shot at the winner of the fight between world champion Dick Tiger and ex-champ Gene Fullmer at Ibadan, Nigeria, July 13.

Papp gave Sandy of New York a bloody beating for a unanimous 10-round decision that extended Laszlo's undefeated professional string to 24 fights, including two draws.

Sandy, a former contender, has been on the skids for three years. He suffered his 22nd defeat in 43 fights, which included two draws.

Portland St. Wins OCC Golf

The Vikings' four-man team, with Mike O'Toole capturing medalist honors with 145, carded a total 36-hole score of 616.

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All-America Ernie Davis Succumbs To Leukemia

CLEVELAND, Ohio (UPI) — Ernie Davis, 23, the All-America football fullback at Syracuse who was stricken with leukemia last summer, died at Lakeside Hospital here Saturday.

Death came at 1 a.m. for the 23-year-old athlete.

Davis had been working for a soft drink company out of Cleveland until two days ago and said he felt well.

He checked in at the Cleveland Browns' office Thursday morning and told Art Modell, club president, that he was going into the hospital for several days.

Dr. Austin Weisberger, who had been treating Davis since the disease was discovered last July, said Davis died without discomfort. Drugs administered to Davis had brought about a complete remission in the disease last fall, but there was a flareup early this year.

Burial will be in Elmira, N. Y., Davis' home town since he was a youngster, early next week.

Davis probably was the most heralded football player ever to come out of college. He was the first Negro winner of the coveted

United States Basketball Team Slated To Meet Reds

RIO DE JANEIRO (UPI) — The United States met Russia in the world basketball championship Saturday night.

The Yanks won their first game of the final round Friday night, easily turning back France 81-61, but with one loss on their record already another defeat could eliminate them in this round-robin tournament.

Russia has won its only game thus far and a win over the United States might be all the encouragement the Russians would need to go on to the championship.

Yugoslavia, the surprise team of the tourney following its upset victory over the United States on Thursday, also remained in strong contention with a convincing 73-57 triumph over Puerto Rico Friday night. Brazil turned back the Italians 81-62, in Friday night's contest for its second straight win.

The United States started slowly against France and could gain only a 36-35 edge at halftime. But a full court press in the final half threw the French off balance

and enabled the Yanks to pile up a solid margin.

Willis Reed and Walt Torrence paced the U.S., scoring with 17 points each.
