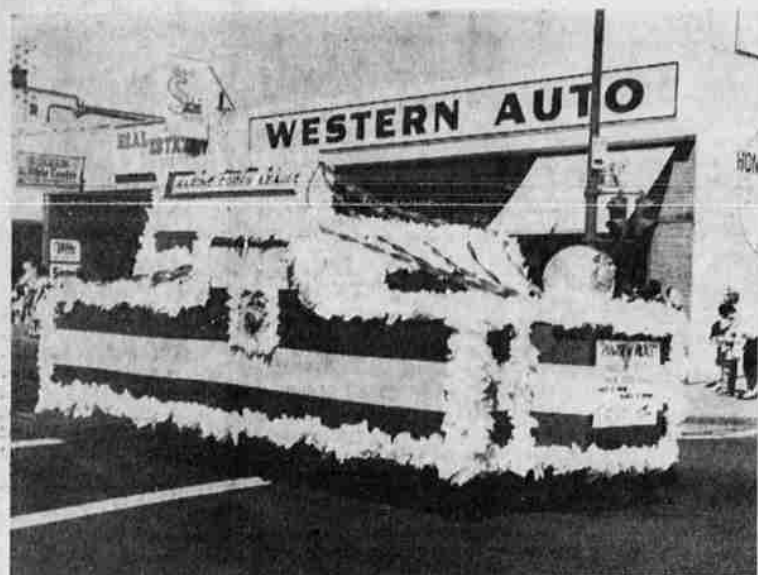


Armed Forces Parade Thrills Viewers



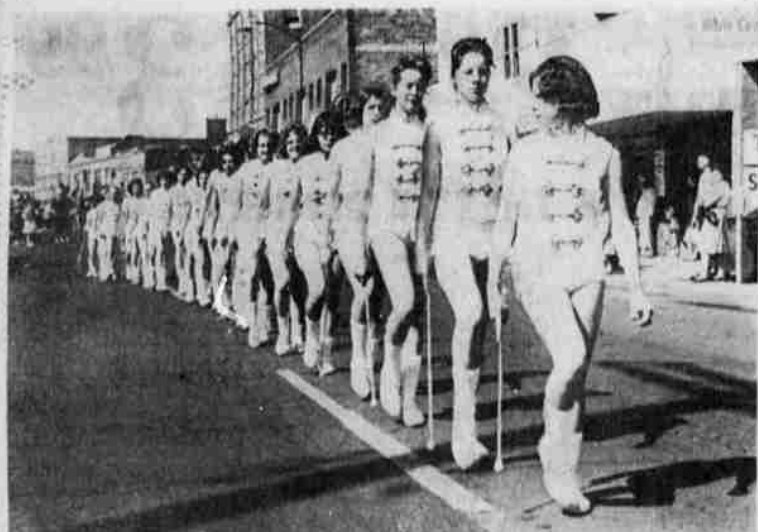
BEAUTIFUL FLOAT — The line of marching units, bands and tanks was broken with this gaily and colorfully bedecked float of the Marine Corps League.

roduced by Sweetland and will give the dedicatory address.

Benediction will be by Chaplain Thoreson.

Senator Goldwater is serving his second Senate term. He has a strong civic background in Phoenix and environs. He is married and has four children, Jeanne (Mrs. Thomas H. Ross), Margaret, Barry Jr. and Michael.

Elected to the Phoenix City Council in 1949, he was reelected in 1951. From there he jumped directly to the U.S. Senate in 1951, and he was reelected in the Senate in 1958.

He serves on several powerful Senate committees including

Labor and Public Welfare, and Armed Services, and he has been chairman of the Republican Senatorial Campaign Committee from January 1955 to February 1956, a position to which he was reelected in January 1959.

A major general in the U.S. Air Force Reserve, Senator Goldwater is a graduate of Staunton Military Academy, and spent one year at the University of Arizona.

He is chairman of the board of Goldwaters, one of the largest retail stores in Arizona. Senator Goldwater's fraternal organization ties include Mason

(33rd degree), Shrine, Elks, Moose, Sigma Chi, Eastern Star, Alkanza, Veterans of Foreign Wars, American Legion and Woodmen of the World.

Following the hospital dedication, Senator Goldwater will be the guest of Kingsley Field at a dinner concluding Armed Forces Week.

Bricklayers Walk Off Oregon State Dorm Job

CORVALLIS (UPI)—Bricklayers walked off an Oregon State University dormitory construction project Friday. The walkout threatened delay of the \$2 million job.

The dispute was over a non-union subcontractor laying tile in the dormitory.

Officials of Todd Building Co., general contractor of the project, expressed concern that the walkout would affect the entire job unless it was settled soon.

The dispute was between Bricklayers Local No. 5 of Salem and the Valley Tile and Marble Co. of Corvallis. The firm had eight nonunion employees on the job.

Four bricklayers left their work when negotiations between the tile company and union failed.
