Naturalist Designated

Richard M. Brown has been designated chief park naturalist for Crater Lake National Park, Sept. W. Ward Yeager announced recently. Brown comes to the park from Mill Valley, California, where he was also chief park naturalist. Previously, he served with the National Park Service seasonally as a park naturalist and then permanently as assistant park naturalist, both at Crater Lake National Park.

Brown attended San Diego State College, San Diego, Calif., for the fall semester, 1943, before enlisting in the United States Naval Reserve. Upon being discharged in 1946, he returned to San Diego State College for two years and then transferred to Pomona College, Claremont, Calif., receiving his Bachelor of Arts degree from that institution in 1950.

He subsequently attended Harvard University for two years, obtaining a Master of Arts degree there in 1952. The University of Michigan for four years, working toward a Ph.D. degree, and San Francisco State College.

Brown's wife, Ann, and their son, David, 2, accompanied him to the park where they will live at park headquarters.

Unemployed Claims Laid To Poor Spring Weather

The statewide rate of insured unemployment at 3.9 per cent in Oregon was up for the week ending May 3 compared to both a year ago (3.0 per cent) and four weeks earlier (3.0 per cent).

Other rates in the larger area compared to a year ago showed Eugene at 6.6 per cent, up 40.3 per cent; Medford at 13.7 per cent, up 13.7 per cent; North Bend-Coos Bay at 7.2 per cent, up 34.9 per cent; Pendleton and Milton-Freewater at 8.1 per cent, up 21.9 per cent; and Salem at 7.7 per cent, up 27.0 per cent.

The amount of unemployment benefits paid out so far this fiscal year, since July 1, 1962, was down 19.3 per cent compared to the same period in the previous fiscal year. Number of payments were also down 19.1 per cent for this period. Also \$24.6 million in benefits have been paid in this fiscal year so far, compared to \$26.9 million in the previous fiscal year.

The Oregon unemployment insurance trust fund contained \$58.3 million on May 6 compared to \$45.3 million a year ago.

THE DALLES (UPI) — One man lost his life and another was critically injured when their light plane crashed about 10 miles southwest of here Friday afternoon.

Killed was John Gene Smith, 28, The Dalles, a passenger in the aircraft. Marquis H. Wollenweber, 42, also of The Dalles and the pilot of the plane, was taken to a Portland hospital.

The plane was owned by Smith's brother, Ivan Smith of The Dalles.

It crashed on a gravel road near Chenoweth Creek after taking off earlier in the afternoon from the Chenoweth Airport. It slammed into a bank and flipped upside down on the roadway.

Witnesses reported that the plane made a pass at a field as it to land and then crashed.
