Big Game Counts Complete, Hearing Set On Regulations

Just over 45,000 mule and black-tailed deer were tallied by district biologists of the game commission on 5,300 miles of sample routes during late winter and spring in the annual study to determine trends in the big game population. The miles traveled were covered on foot, horseback, automobile, and airplane. The only herd on which data is incomplete is the interstate herd. The count here will continue for two or three weeks yet as the herd migrates from California into Oregon.

On a state-wide basis, blacktail deer trends were up slightly from a year ago, while mule deer trends were down slightly from a year ago. On 2,149 miles of sample route on the blacktail ranges the deer observed averaged out at 3.9 deer per mile compared to 4.8 deer per mile in 1962. Mule deer trends in Eastern Oregon averaged out at 11.1 deer per mile compared to 11.9 a year ago. Inventories were made on 3,139 miles of sample route on mule deer winter ranges.

Biologists pointed out that fluctuations occurred on most ranges with some above the trends of 1962, while others were below the trends of 1962. Also reported was the widespread dispersal of big game on most ranges throughout the winter. In addition, many animals spent the winter high in the mountains on their normal summer range. Game officials feel the wide dispersal at high elevations may have influenced the trend counts on some ranges since most of the permanent sample routes do not extend into big game summer areas.

In northwestern Oregon, black-tail samples averaged out identical to those of 1962, at 3.7 deer per mile. Populations were up slightly in the Wilson, Polk, Alsea, Clatsop and Nestucca; identical in the McKenzie unit; and down slightly in the Trask, Siuslaw, and Santiam. The blacktails also were up slightly in Hood River and Wasco units from a year ago.

In southwestern Oregon, the over-all blacktail trend was down slightly from 5.8 deer per mile in 1962 to 5.7 in 1963. In this region, populations were the same as the previous year in the Umpqua and Chetco units; up in the Sixes, Evans Creek, Douglas, Butte Falls and Applegate units; and down in the Coquille.

Populations of Green Springs units, these latter three all reflect poor fawn production and survival.

In central Oregon mule deer numbers showed a drop from 7.5 deer per mile in 1962 to 6.5 deer per mile in 1963. The 1963 trend was identical to the tally per mile in 1961. Again, mule deer herds were up in the Sprague, Ochoco and Maupin units; and down slightly in the Deschutes, Grizzly, Klamath, Maury, Metolius and Paulina units. Fawn production and survival in the Paulina unit was only 45 fawns per 100 does, 44 in the Metolius, 47 in the Maury unit, 54 in the Grizzly country, and 50 in the Deschutes unit. Even in the better units in central Oregon, fawn production was considered low.

Northeastern Oregon region averaged out at 13.1 deer per mile compared to 13.4 a year ago. Although fluctuations occurred on several ranges, fawn production and survival was recorded low on only two units, the Baker unit with 38 fawns per 100 does and Murderer's Creek with 36 fawns per 100 does. Fawn production and survival was considered good to excellent on all other ranges in northeastern Oregon.

Trend counts showed slight declines in the population in the Baker, Catherine Creek, Heppner, Imnaha, Minam, Northside, Sled Springs, Walla Walla, Wenaha and Wheeler units. Increases were noted in the Cheshinmum, Desola-

tion, Keating, Lookout Mountain, Murderer's Creek, Snake River, Starkey, Ukiah and Umatilla units.

The southeast region also showed a slight decline in population with the trend count for all units averaging out at 11.2 deer per mile compared to 12.7 a year ago. The Beulah unit was down reflecting two years of low fawn production. The Fort Rock unit was down slightly from last year but above the 1960 level. Resident deer herds in the interstate unit were down slightly from the three previous years. Malheur and Owyhee units were down from last year, again reflecting two years of very poor fawn production. The Silvies and Warner units were down slightly from a year ago.

The Whitehorse unit showed an upward trend in population numbers as did the Steens Mountain and Silver Lake units.

Elk trend information shows fairly stable herds among the Roosevelt as well as Rocky Mountain elk. Roosevelt elk populations showed a slight upward trend from 4.1 elk per mile last year to 4.7 elk per mile this year. Slight increases were noted on herd ranges in southwest as well as northwest Oregon.

Populations of Rocky Mountain elk were almost identical to that of a year ago, averaging out at 5.7 elk per mile compared to 6.0 a year ago. Fluctuations were noted on all eastern Oregon ranges. Biologists report that many Rocky Mountain elk herds failed to migrate onto the more open ranges this past winter.

From the standpoint of food production, measurement of range transects showed excessive bitterbrush utilization on a number of ranges in several big game management units. Most severe utilization of bitterbrush was noted on ranges in the Klamath unit where 34 per cent use was recorded. Maury unit ranges where utilization was recorded at 60 per cent; Ochoco unit ranges with 60 per cent use; Sprague unit with 54 per cent; and the Heppner unit ranges where use was recorded at 30 per cent.

Individual herd ranges receiving excessive utilization include Crane Mountain in the Malheur unit, South Side John Day in the Murderer's Creek unit, Goodlow Mountain range in the Klamath unit, and the North Ochoco range in the Ochoco unit.

Giant Officials Don't Know Secret

SAN FRANCISCO (UPI) — What's holding the San Francisco Giants up on that first rung in the National League pennant race?

Don't ask manager Alvin Dark. He doesn't know. Neither does Vice President Chub Feeney or any of the other magicians connected with the Giants' organization.

"We just aren't hitting," says Dark. "And we aren't fielding."

That's obvious. But the giants still cling to first place.

They hold a one game margin over the arch rival Los Angeles Dodgers going into tonight's battle with the Philadelphia Phillies. Billy O'Dell (5-0) of the Giants was scheduled to oppose Ray Culp (4-2). The two teams had a break in their four-game series Monday.

As a team, the Giants are batting at only a .249 rate. And they are fielding at a weak .972 clip. They have made 29 errors, nearly a third of what they made all last season. They have made only 21 double plays—low in the league. The pitching has been spotty and only Jack Sanford looks reliable on the hill.

For a club noted as a slugging unit, this team is looking more like Hitless Wonders. Only they aren't so bad, but some of these averages have been fattened with the bases empty hits. Clutch hitting just hasn't been a trademark so far this season—except, possibly, for catcher Ed Bailey.

Willie Mays is batting .269 against .304 last season. Catcher Tom Haller is .250 against .267. Jim Davenport .240 against .291. Jose Pagan is only .215 against .259. And the 1962 league's leading fielding shortstop already has made more errors than he usually does in a half season.

Chuck Hiller, before he was sidelined with a cracked bone in his hand, was hitting only .127 against .276 in 1962. Harvey Kuenn, used only sparingly, is hitting .192 against .292 and Joey Amalfitano .188 against .237.

Dark and the rest of the Giants brass are firm in their belief that the boys will snap out of it. They waited out a 100-point slump by Felipe Alou and it paid off with

Reds, Brazil Meet In Tilt

RIO DE JANEIRO (UPI) — A meeting between Brazil's defending titleholder and the Soviet Union Thursday night should settle the 1963 world amateur basketball championships.

Brazil handed Yugoslavia its first defeat Monday night, rolling to a 30-point lead in the second half en route to a 90-71 victory. It was the Brazilians' third victory against no defeats in the final round robin series.

The Russians, unbeaten in two final round games, play Puerto Rico (10-3) tonight. Brazil meets France (12-2) and then will gain a one-day respite before its showdown meeting with Russia.

The United States team, which won the recent Pan-American Games title, is virtually out of the running after losses to Yugoslavia and the Soviet Union. The Yanks, idle Monday night, do not swing into action again until Wednesday night when they meet Puerto Rico.
