

Giles Singles Out Milwaukee Club

MILWAUKEE (UPI)—President Warren Giles of the National League, stepping up baseball's campaign to have players avoid "undesirable elements" has singled out a night club in Milwaukee as a place for them to stay away from.

"Gamblers and hustlers frequent the place," Giles told the clubs in a memo, according to a Braves spokesman. He said it was the only place pinpointed by Giles out of all 10 cities in the league. The league president's communique was issued about a month ago when the professional football scandal broke, but wasn't made known until now.

Gambler Scandal Tie-In
However, the Braves spokesman said it was known that managers of all the teams know certain places in each league city they have told players to stay out of.

"There probably is a tie-in here with the national football league's gambling scandal," said the Braves spokesman. The same night club had been frequented by members of the Green Bay Packers and visiting NFL teams when they played in Milwaukee. Circuit Judge Robert Cannon of Milwaukee, legal counsel for the major league baseball players, was quoted as saying "There aren't enough lawyers in the world to defend me," if he identified the establishment to the public.

"Informal" Memo
Giles' memo was described as "informal" and spelled out no penalties for any player who would go to the night club despite the warning.

Crowds Attend Funeral

ELMIRA, N.Y. (UPI)—Sports fans and celebrities, congressmen and thousands of friends from throughout the eastern United States gathered here today for the funeral of football great Ernie Davis.

More than 11,000 persons filed past his open casket as it lay in state Tuesday, according to city officials.

A group of 30 players and coaches of the Cleveland Browns National League football team were to fly here for the funeral and act as honorary bearers. Their route from Chemung County Airport was through roadways and streets lined with flags flying at half-staff in tribute to the 25-year-old Negro athlete who got his start in football here as a boy.

One of the players who planned to fly in with the Browns was halfback Bobby Mitchell, who was traded from the Cleveland club to Washington when Davis signed an \$80,000 yearly contract with the Browns.

Davis never realized his ambition to play professional football. Following his graduation from Syracuse University last summer, doctors discovered the leukemia that led to his death last Saturday in a Cleveland hospital.

Davis, born in Uniontown, Pa., began his career in sports here as a standout on the Elmira Free Academy football team in 1956-58. He went on to star as a two-time All-American at Syracuse University and was awarded the coveted Heisman Trophy as the nation's outstanding gridiron star of 1961.

Arthur Modell, president of the Cleveland club, flew here Tuesday for a tearful mourning of his player.

Palmer, who has been resting at home on orders from his physician for the past week, left the tourney trail because of a bad back after one of his poorest professional showings in the Colonial Invitation at Fort Worth, Tex., May 12.

"I've just started practicing again," Palmer said yesterday. Ranked fourth among the money winners so far this season, Palmer hopes the rest will help him regain the form which has kept him at or around the pinnacle of money winners in recent seasons.
