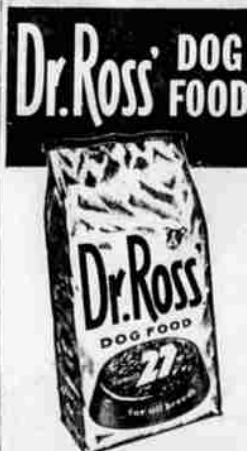

### BEEF NOODLE PAPRIKA

- (Servings - 4)
- 1 1/2 pounds boneless chuck, cut in medium-sized pieces
  - 2 tablespoons poly-unsaturated oil
  - 2 large onions, chopped
  - 1 clove garlic, minced
  - 1 tablespoon paprika
  - 2 teaspoons salt
  - pinch cayenne
  - 2 cups water
  - 1 8-ounce can tomato sauce
  - 1/2 pound wide noodles
  - 1 cup commercial sour cream

Brown meat in oil. Add onion and continue browning. Add garlic, paprika, salt, cayenne, tomato sauce, and water. Bring to a boil. Cover and simmer about 1 1/2 hours, until tender. Add noodles and cook until done, adding more water if necessary. Stir in sour cream just before serving.



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**PERSEVERANCE** — The story of how a fine American china was produced is a story of the determination of one man, Walter Scott Lenox, who, though blind, continued toward his goal until he realized success. This special service shown recently in a "Command Performance" at Garcelon's was ordered by President Harry Truman in 1952. The Presidential seal encircled by 48 gold stars is etched in raised gold in the center of the service plate and on the rim of the dinner plate. The plate's border features a narrow band of teal green circling a design in etched gold.

An American Success Story

One of the oldest—and finest—arts in the world is, of course, the creating of beautiful music. Another is the making of beautiful china. . . . the potter's art that has captured the imagination for thousands of years. And in each, the single mindedness and the genius of the individual have been necessary to their creation.

Such is the story of Walter Scott Lenox. From the time he was a boy in the potteries of Trenton, he dreamed of being the master potter of America. Someday, somehow he was going to create an American china of such beauty and quality that it could surpass the finest from abroad.

Through years of apprenticeship, that goal was firmly fixed in his mind, and at last, in 1889, he was ready to start his own pottery. For years he experimented, produced, rejected, but his dream of fine American china was so important to Walter Scott Lenox, that he persevered.

Even when he was stricken to

ally blind, he refused to give up. And then, one day it happened, the pottery produced a beautiful, translucent ivory-tinted china with a rich, lustrous glaze. It was the first of its kind ever produced in America and it excelled the finest imported from abroad.

That china has been selected for many years as the official dinner china for the White House. Today, it is famous, too, throughout all the world. It is seen in royal palaces, at ambassadors' tables, famous museums and in this country's homes. It is a fitting tribute to the guiding genius of the man who would not give up.
