Circus Features Bareback Riders

Doing their spectacular, world-famous bareback riding act in the Klamath County Sheriff's Posse sponsored circus will be the riding Kristensen-Ussin troupe from Europe. The group, originated in Denmark and has appeared with major European and American circuses. Young, attractive, beautifully trained and costumed, the troupe consists of two families, husband, wife and small son each. All, except Perko Ussin, who was an actress and dancer before her marriage, are from old circus families carrying on in the grand tradition.

Jack Ussin is the only man in the circus world today who performs the spectacular and dangerous feat of going under the belly of a horse at full gallop around the ring. Doing this act while with the Cossack Riders in Europe, Ussin's back was broken, and he was hospitalized for two and a half years. But in the best tradition of the circus he is again defying death to amaze circus audiences.

Oregon Leads Country In Timber Production

SALEM — Oregon harvested last year. It held second and third position steadily during 1942 through 1950. Coos and Curry counties were fourth and fifth, as they were last year, with volumes of 522,979,000 and 491,190,000 board feet respectively dropping from their usual third and fourth of the two years previous.

In the forests of eastern Oregon, Klamath County, the biggest timber producer up until 1951, stepped into first place for the second time in three years with a volume harvest of 248,715,000 board feet. Grant County, occupying an undisputed first place from 1951 through 1959 came up second best with a volume of 173,494,000 board feet. Lake County managed a third, having maintained this station or better since 1953, with a current volume of 167,032,000 board feet.

The tabulation of log production has no direct relationship to lumber production of the state, since some of the logs go to adjacent states, while there is also a volume of imports. Too, large stocks of logs can be carried over from one year to the next in cold decks, rafts and booms.

Merger Plan Protested

LAKEVIEW — Protest has been expressed to the Girl Scout headquarters in Seattle by the local Scout Council over being included in a merger for a larger council which was revealed in a letter sent to parents from headquarters.

The local group, of which Mrs. G. W. Thornburg is president, has consistently voted against being included in the merger. The Lake County Council stated that it strenuously objected to the term, "Five Councils," as used in the letter to parents. The letter came out of the public relations work group for Project No. 10. The council felt when two of the five councils have voted against the proposed merger, it should not be inferred that all five councils are in agreement.

Of the five councils, Lake County and Rogue Valley voted overwhelmingly not to join the larger group. Locally the organization feels that more is being done for the girls by the distribution of funds here at home than could be accomplished by an administration so far away from home.

Welcome Week Date Slated

Gov. Mark Hatfield will officially proclaim and launch Oregon Welcome Week May 29 during a luncheon meeting at the Marion Motor Hotel in Salem. Hatfield will be introduced at the luncheon by State Highway Engineer Forrest Cooper.

The governor's speech will herald the start of the 1963 vacation season and will stress the importance of all Oregonians being good hosts to out-of-state visitors. Tourism is Oregon's third largest industry and brought more than \$280 million to Oregon last year, according to Oregon State Highway Department surveys.

The luncheon is being sponsored by the Salem Chamber of Commerce, the Oregon Welcome Committee and the State Highway Department.

Oregon Welcome Week is June 3 through 8. It will be observed throughout the state with special programs during the week. More than 35 such programs have been scheduled in most major cities.

Speakers will be provided by a visitors' bureau consisting of members of the Highway Department's Travel Information Division Advisory Committee, the Oregon Welcome Committee, other officials in the travel industry, and toastmasters clubs throughout the state. The programs will be sponsored by chambers of commerce and civic clubs.

In conjunction with Welcome Week, the State Highway Department has distributed more than 200,000 pieces of literature to chambers of commerce, park offices of the Highway Department, visitor information centers and other offices dealing with tourists.

The literature includes maps, park and forest camp guides, schedules of events, general vacation booklets, and material for promoting increased tourist travel. The material includes colorful window display cards, "tent" cards for restaurant tables and counters, windshield courtesy cards for police department use and large billboard posters.

Welcome Week is planned to inform Oregon residents of the importance of helping visitors feel welcome and encouraging them to stay here longer.

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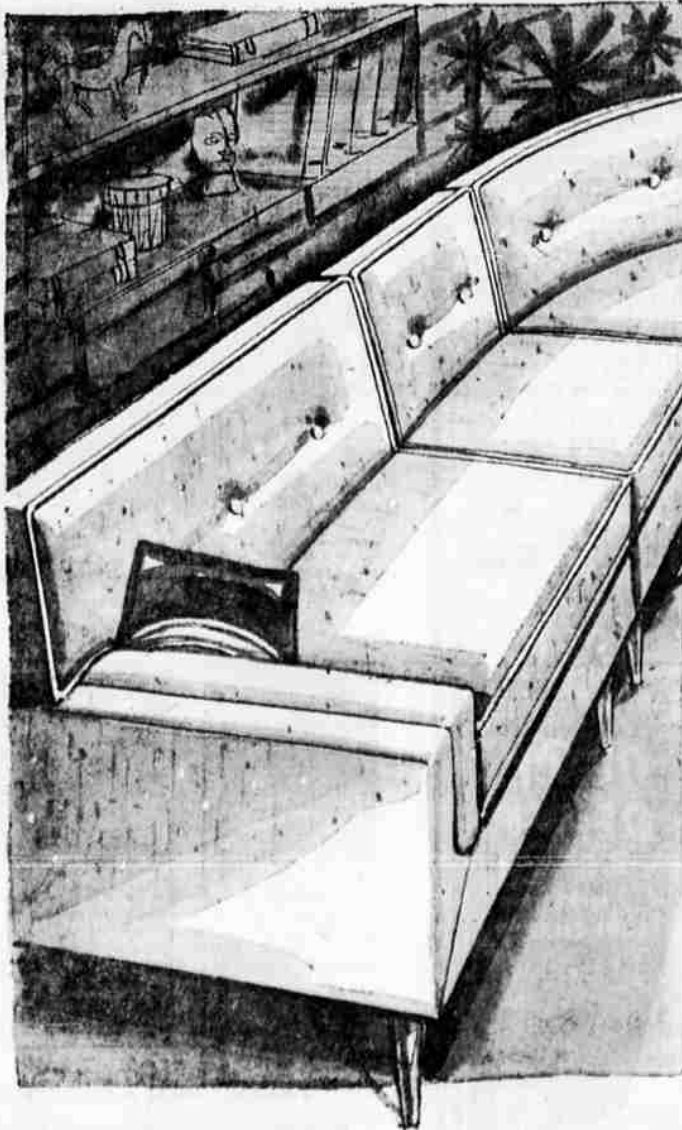
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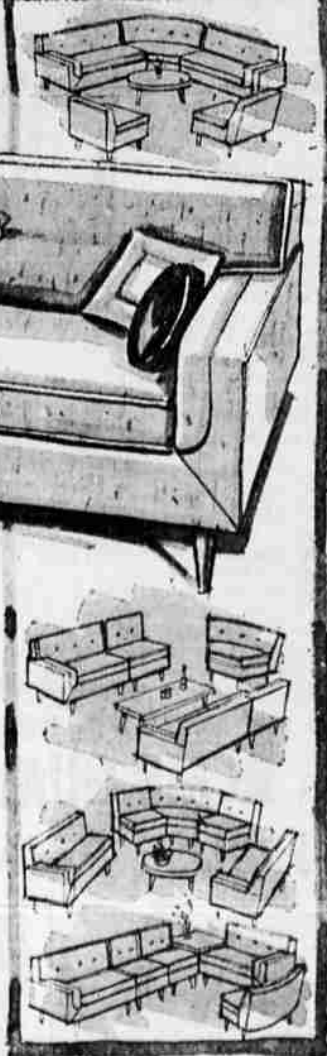
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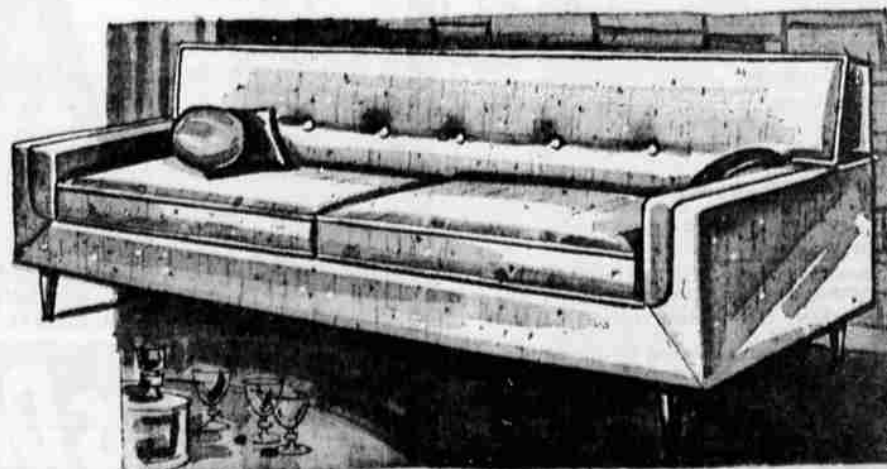
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
