

Bandleader's Death To Be Investigated

PALM DESERT, Calif. (UPI)—An autopsy was scheduled today into the death of bandleader Eddy Howard, whose recording of "To Each His Own" captured the fancy of a war-weary nation in 1941.

Howard, 48, who chose a baton over a surgeon's scalpel and a businessman's adding machine, apparently died in his sleep of natural causes. His body was found Thursday by his widow, Jane, in their bungalow at the same El Dorado resort where former President Dwight D. Eisenhower maintains a winter home.

In addition to leading a romantic band in the era of the big bands, Howard composed such tunes as "My Last Goodbye." "A Million Dreams Ago," "So Long For Now," "Now I Lay Me Down To Dream," "Lonesome Tonight," "Careless," and "If I knew Then."

But he was best remembered for his band's rendition of "To Each His Own," which became his theme song in addition to selling more than two million records.

Altogether Howard had 11 gold records that sold over a million copies each. His hit recordings also included "Ricky Rickshaw."

His early success enabled him to retire at a relatively young age, but his love of music and people won out occasionally over leisurely delights and he returned to the bandstand from time to time for personal appearances and recording sessions.

Howard, his widow, their son, Eddy Jr., 13, and a daughter, Lynn, 21, moved here three years ago. Howard appeared occasionally at a local hotel, the El Mirador.

Yankee Mountaineers Heading Down Everest

KATMANDU, Nepal (UPI)—Four Americans, who wrote a page of mountaineering history with a twin assault of Mt. Everest, were working their way back down the world's highest mountain today.

Radio reports from the American expedition base camp Thursday night said the four had reached Camp 4 at the 22,900-foot level—nearly 5,000 feet down from the peak—and were safe and well.

The four men who conquered the mountain—reaching the summit by different routes within three hours of each other, Wednesday—are Dr. Thomas Hornbein, 32, San Diego; Dr. William Unsoeld, 36, Corvallis, Ore.; Barry C. Bishop, 30, Washington, and Luther G. Jerstad, 26, Eugene, Ore.

Hornbein and Unsoeld scaled the peak by the previously unexplored west ridge; Bishop and Jerstad by the south col (pass) route which had been used on three previous climbs.

Expedition leader Norman G. Dyhrenfurth, 44, Santa Monica, Calif., radioed from the base camp that Bishop and Jerstad, who reached the top first, saw Hornbein and Unsoeld climbing up the west ridge toward them and decided to wait for them.

They retired a few hundred feet to get out of the wind while Hornbein and Unsoeld inched up the last few hundred yards by driving pitons into the sheer face.

It was 9 p.m. when they joined forces. Night had fallen and they were unable to find camp 6 at the 27,450-foot level in the dark. They decided to spend the night in the snow despite the scarcity of oxygen in the rarefied atmosphere.

Tender Vegetable Crops Threatened By Cold Snap

By United Press International. A crippling cold snap shattered low temperature records across the northeastern portion of the nation today and threatened to wipe out millions of dollars worth of tender fruit and vegetable crops.

State police said farmers at Erie, Pa., were "burning everything they could get their hands on" in a frantic effort to ward off damage to lush groves of grapes, peaches, apples and cherries.

The president of one of the four largest wineries in central New York said the skidding temperatures may wipe out the \$100 million grape crop.
