

Old Nemesis Robin Roberts Spoils Gil's Managerial Debut

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Portland's Bonus Baby Two Hits Big San Diego

Portland pitcher Lew Krause apparently has cured the one Pacific League record of which he was least proud—that of king of the gopher ballers.

Butters have belted 11 homers off the 20-year-old right-hander thus far this year. But Krause, who was signed by the Kansas City Athletics for \$125,000 two years ago, proved Thursday that he now can zip the baseball just where he wants it around the corners of home plate.

He set down fence-busting San Diego 1-0 on two hits—a third-inning double by Jim Saul and an eighth-inning single by Rog Alvarez. Padre batters had crashed Portland pitching for eight home runs in two previous games.

Krause, who leads the PCL in home-runs-allowed, hurled his finest game of the young season. He struck out four and walked two to even his record at 3-3. His earned-run average of 7.05, one of the highest in the league, nose-dived as a result.

The 6-foot-1 Krause also scored the game's only run in the eighth after he singled and moved to third on Jay Hankins' double. A walk loaded the bases and Jim Hughes scored. Krause with a perfect squeeze bunt.

Padre pitcher Greg Jancich, who also went the route, allowed

Portland only four hits, two of them singles by Krause.

In other games, two-run homers by Lou Klimchuck and Tommy Aaron gave Denver a 12-6 win over Salt Lake City, Dallas-Ft. Worth tallied seven runs in the first two innings to rip Oklahoma City 10-3 and the San Francisco Giants swatted four home runs in downing their farm team Tacoma 6-1.

Amazing Denver won its fifth in a row and vaulted from last to third place in the Southern Division ahead of Oklahoma City and Salt Lake. The Bears scored six runs in the seventh to come from a 3-4 deficit.

Billy Cowan, the leading hitter in the PCL with a .364 average, had put Salt Lake ahead 4-1 when he smacked a three-run homer in the fifth.

Dallas-Ft. Worth scored three runs in the first and four in the second to wrap up its game early against the 89ers. Joe Christian drove in three of the Texas runs with two doubles and a single. Teammate George Banks went 4-for-3, including his fourth home run.

George Williams hit a solo home run for Oklahoma City and Catcher Hal Smith added a two-run circuit smash with two out in the ninth.

San Francisco catcher Ed Bailey hit two homers and Matty Alou

Orioles Defeat Washington, 6-0

Robin Roberts always did have Gil Hodges' number.

In the glory years for both, circa 1960 through 1962, Roberts won 138 games for the Philadelphia Phillies and Hodges hit 204 home runs for the Brooklyn Dodgers.

In man-to-man competition, however, Roberts held a wide edge over Hodges, yielding only six of those 204 homers by Hodges during those seasons.

It's a full decade later and Roberts is a 36-year-old pitcher hanging on with guile and savvy while Hodges is embarking on a new career as a major league manager.

Starts Managerial Career

Big Gil made his managerial debut with the Washington Senators Thursday night and the wheel of fate ruled that Mr. Roberts would be on the mound for the rival Baltimore Orioles. The league, the circumstances and the players were different but the result was pretty much the same—Roberts topped Hodges by pitching the Orioles to a 6-0 victory over the Senators.

"A couple of times I felt like taking a bat and going up to hit myself," Hodges confessed after the game. "But I don't imagine it would have done any good."

Roberts, 1962 comeback of the year player in the majors, started slowly this season but has been a major cog in the Orioles' drive of nine wins in their last 16 games which has carried them into a half-game lead in the American League. He's won three straight complete games, allowing a total of only four runs and 11 hits.

The Cincinnati Reds scored a 2-0 victory over the Milwaukee Braves and the St. Louis Cardinals defeated the Chicago Cubs 1-0 in Thursday's only other major league games.

Strikes Out Seven

Roberts faced only 29 men, struck out seven and didn't allow a runner past second base in posting his first shutout since entering the AL in mid-1962. Home runs by Al Smith and Jerry Adair paced an attack which dealt Claude Osteen his fourth loss in a row. The Orioles have beaten the Senators six straight times this season and are 12-1 against left-handed pitching.

Roberts' three victories against four losses this season give him a career record of 247 triumphs and 212 defeats.

Jim O'Toole pitched a three-hitter to raise his record to 7-3 with the Reds, who scored unearned runs in the fourth and ninth innings against Denver Le-master. Daryl Spencer doubled home the Reds' fourth-inning run and Ken Walters singled home their run in the ninth.

Gene Oliver homered in the fifth inning to give Ernie Broglio the only run he needed to win his fifth game and push the Cardinals into third place in the National League. The shutout—Broglio fanned five and walked two—was the seventh by the Cardinal staff this season and marked the fifth time the Cubs were whitewashed.

But as powerful as all the athletes were, the spotlight was centered on the mile race, featuring Peter Snell of New Zealand and Jim Beatty of United States, plus Bobby Seaman, Cary Weisiger and Jim Grelle—all sub-four minute milers.

There was some speculation that the world mark of 3:54.4, now held by Snell, would fall—and by a full second or more. The track is fast and the forecast is for good weather.

This event is set for 7:45 and will be televised nationally.

But there are other great sports figures entered, too.

Among these is John Penni of Northeast Louisiana, who has cleared 16 feet, 6 1/2 inches in the pole vault and is the world record holder. And included among the 16-foot competition is Brian Sternberg of University of Washington, who has topped 16 feet, 5 inches. Sternberg competes in the afternoon in the Big Six meet at Berkeley, then will race the 90 miles to Modesto to try again where the competition is tougher.

The 200-foot mark will be the aim in the discus, where Al Oster, Rink Babka, Bob Humphreys, Dave Weill and Jay Silverster will battle each other for the 'unlabeled' title. They are the country's best.

Most of the field in the shot put has been out past the 60-foot mark—so the only big thrill there may be if someone approaches 70 feet. Included are Gary Gubner, Dave Steen, Dave Davis, John McGrath and Parry O'Brien.

The top relay teams in the country also will swing into action. They are Southern Illinois, Oregon, Stanford, Texas Southern, Oregon State, San Jose State, Southern California, Florida, A & M Athletic Club and California.

Folley Whips Cleroux

MONTREAL (UPI) — Zora Folley, perennial contender to the heavyweight throne, today looked ahead to an outdoor meeting against former and sometimes retired champion Ingemar Johansson of Sweden following his unanimous decision over Canadian Bob Cleroux.

Folley, weighing six pounds less than his Canadian opponent at 200 pounds, demonstrated a near matchless ring artistry and increased aggressiveness Thursday night en route to his lopsided 10-round victory over his younger opponent from Montreal. The 31-year-old Chandler, Ariz., battler barely worked up a sweat as he fashed the awkward and inept, but ever willing, Cleroux at will.

The victory, Folley's 64th in 73 professional bouts, was his second lopsided decision over the 25-year-old Canadian swinger. He defeated Cleroux almost as handily April 18, 1962, in San Francisco.

Cleroux, who eagerly announced "I'd like to fight him again right away," couldn't have been a better choice in making a master boxer like Folley look good. His counter punches repeatedly stung Cleroux (39-4-1) but he couldn't put the bullish Canadian down.

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
