Our Mysterious Enemy

Who is the man eager to lead 700 million Chinese against the "paper tiger" United States? What caused his fanatical obsession with strength and ultimate war?

MAO TSE-TUNG—uncrowned emperor of China—will celebrate his 70th birthday this year. He is the absolute autocrat of 700 million people: more human beings than have ever been governed by one man in all recorded history.

He has given China its first strong, internally solid government since the 18th-century reign of the great Manchu emperor, Ch'ien Lung, and the shadow of his power lies darkly across the future.

But he is tormented by a growing sense of frustration and urgency. Time is running out, and power-hungry Mao has much to do. It is his destiny, he believes, to bring Communist "liberation" to yet other hundreds of millions of brown and yellow people in Southeast Asia, India, and the vast archipelago of Indonesia, to reconquer Formosa, reclaim Korea, and make Japan an industrial satellite of his new Chinese Empire. In doing so, he would acquire new sources of raw materials (especially oil) and new rice-growing areas to relieve his chronic food shortage.

This is a dangerous dream, and the dreamer is a coolheaded, calculating, exceptionally dangerous man. He knows that to achieve his dream he must defeat the power that shattered the Japanese dream of an Asian empire—the maritime power of the United States.

MAO, WHO BECAME all-powerful in China through 20 years of guerrilla war, believes that "all political power grows out of the muzzle of a gun." A chief source of his current frustration is that he himself has no gun which he can hold at America's head, and his Communist colleague Nikita Khrushchev—who does have such a gun—cannot be made to agree that it is his sacred revolutionary duty to intimidate the Americans with his nuclear weapons and thus prevent them from interfering with Mao's step-by-step conquest of free Asia.

This is, of course, an oversimplification of the facts of nuclear strategy and nuclear deterrence; the problem is not that easy. But Mao apparently thinks it is, and that points up his lack of knowledge of the world—another reason why he is dangerous. Mao has read deeply in the Chinese classics, Chinese history, and also a wide variety of Western works that have been translated into Chinese. But he has never been in a non-Communist foreign country himself nor learned a foreign language. He is ignorant of the outside world, a victim of his own propaganda—that the capitalist world is rotten and will crumble in the first winds of conflict.
