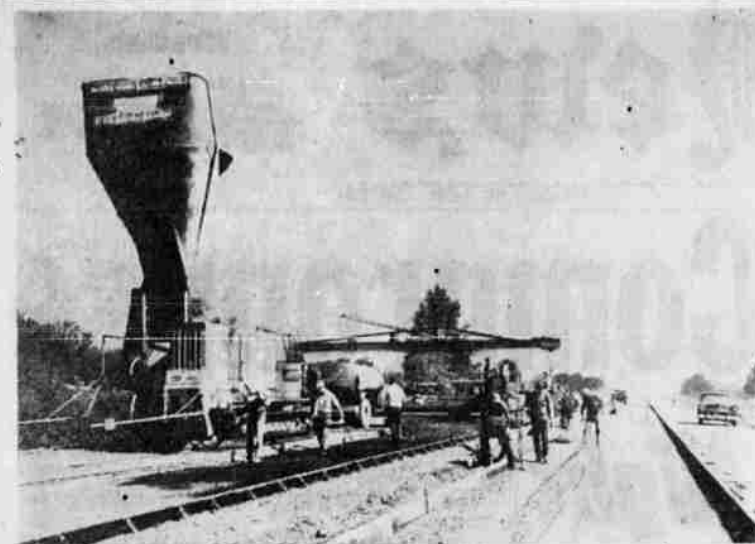




MODERN ROAD PAVES — This modern concrete paver is a considerable improvement over old methods of road building when horse-drawn fresas and similar equipment were contracted for use by the Oregon State Highway Department. The paver mixes its own concrete as it travels along Interstate 5 in Southern Oregon. A large bucket runs along the boom to dump concrete into the forms. The tall stack, called a "skip," is lowered to the ground to receive truckloads of cement and aggregate and then returns to a vertical position to feed the mixer. Other equipment operated by the State Highway Department went on display at the local offices of the department yesterday in observance of National Highway Week, which started last Monday and ends Saturday.

Interstate Highway Effort Largest Construction Task

Construction of the 41,000-mile Interstate Highway System, started in 1956 to give the nation a modern freeway network, is the largest construction project ever undertaken. It is also the largest construction job in Oregon's history.

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Take the Panama Canal, the Grand Coulee Dam, and the St. Lawrence Seaway, combine them into one gigantic construction project, then multiply it 35 times. This is the equivalent of the huge roadbuilding program now scheduled under the Interstate System.

Aggregates — sand, gravel, crushed stone and slag—needed for the Interstate System alone would supply material to build a wall 50 feet wide and nine feet high completely around the world at the equator.

The portland cement concrete that will be used in the Interstate System would build more than 80 monoliths the size of Hoover Dam. That much concrete would provide six sidewalks to the moon.

The bitumens—tar and asphalt—to be used in pavements, bases, and shoulders of the Interstate

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Public Works Funds Set For Paisley Unit

Congressman Al Ullman today announced the allocation of \$165,000 in Accelerated Public Works funds for range rehabilitation in the Paisley unit of the Lakeview Grazing District. Contracts will be awarded as soon as possible and will provide for 9,000 acres of seeding, 55 miles of fencing, ten reservoirs and five wells.

"Today's allocation is very gratifying because it is a result of our request that the highest priority be given to this desperately needed range rehabilitation work in the Paisley unit," declared Ullman. "Securing of Accelerated Public Works funds required extra effort because Lake County only became eligible on March 8 when virtually all available funds had long since been committed."

\$165,000 is the maximum amount that can be obligated before the end of the fiscal year and will put the range rehabilitation program ahead of schedule. Earlier this year the Bureau of Land Management met with range users to discuss the need for grazing cutbacks in the Paisley unit because of the serious state of range depletion.

"I have long been an advocate of large scale range rehabilitation to bring back the productive capacity of our vast public domain," said Ullman. "All America benefits from such a program."

The Oregon delegation explained that the APW program was established last fall to provide jobs in areas of serious unemployment by accelerating work on needed public projects. The law requires the contractors to use unemployed workers from the eligible area.

\$165,000 for range rehabilitation is the second allocation of APW funds to Lake County. On April 4, Congressman Ullman and Senators Morse and Neuberger announced the allocation of \$200,000 for construction work on U.S. 395 north of Lakeview. "Jim Ogle, the Lake County judge, had written us about the desperate need for highway work and range rehabilitation funds for those two purposes," stated Congressman Ullman.

Traveling as a group, the Kiwanis European Mission visited Vienna, Austria, on Friday, May 3, and the following day assisted in chartering the Vienna Kiwanis Club.

Monday, May 6, the tour took them to Zurich, Switzerland, and Wednesday to Basel, where on Thursday they aided in the chartering ceremonies for a Kiwanis club in Basel.

Paris was the port of call on Friday, May 10, then on to Amsterdam, The Netherlands on Sunday, May 12, Brussels, Belgium, for the chartering of a new Kiwanis club on Monday, May 13. A visit in London on May 14, and the air trip home to New York on Thursday, May 16, climaxed the whirlwind good-will tour.
