

Lawmakers Work Out Mail Fund Compromise

WASHINGTON (UPI)—Rep. J. side of the Capitol for compromise talks to iron out differences in Senate and House appropriations bills.

No Surgery For Climbers

WASHINGTON (UPI)—The danger that two U.S. Mt. Everest climbers, Barry Bishop and William F. Unsoeld, might face amputation of their frostbitten toes was lessened, it was reported here today.

A spokesman for the National Geographic Society, a chief sponsor of the expedition, said latest information from Katmandu was "there are no plans to operate."

He said both men have regained feeling in their toes and "this is an encouraging sign."

Bishop, a resident of Washington, D.C., and Unsoeld, of Corvallis, Ore., suffered severe frostbite after reaching the top of Everest. They had to be carried piggy-back from the summit and airlifted by helicopter to Katmandu for hospital treatment.

Investigators Say Sugar Prices To Start Downturn

WASHINGTON (UPI)—Agriculture Department spokesmen told Senate investigators today that "the tide has turned" in the sugar squeeze and prices should start coming down.

Both Undersecretary Charles S. Murphy and Lawrence Meyer, head of the department's sugar division, predicted that the crisis which saw prices skyrocket is over.

The witnesses, appearing before a Senate finance subcommittee, denied an accusation by Chairman Harry F. Byrd, D-Va., that the department showed a "lack of concern" over the price rise.

They noted that prices had fallen sharply on the sugar markets since last Friday. Murphy blamed two bad crop years in Western Europe and loss of Cuban production to the free world for the increases.

Under questioning by Byrd, Murphy acknowledged that the sugar price boom profited "growers and speculators who were for-

lunate enough to get out in profits" for suppliers. He said a formal report on the inquiry will be submitted to the Senate Armed Services Committee, possibly within two weeks.

Cyclone Rips Pakistan

DACCA, East Pakistan (UPI)—A vicious cyclone with winds up to 140 miles an hour smashed across 5,000 square miles of the East Pakistan coast today, killing an estimated 1,000 persons and causing tremendous property damage.

First sketchy reports indicated that wooden houses and huts in the region were destroyed by the thousands.

Telephone poles were uprooted by the winds. All communications between the city of Dacca, capital of East Pakistan near the Bay of Bengal, were cut off.

Commercial airline pilots asked to check the disaster area were unable to land because of floodwaters that swept over airport runways in the path of the storm.

The control tower at Dacca airport failed in all efforts to contact the city of Chittagong by radio. Chittagong is in the center of the cyclone-struck area.

Telegraph wires between Dacca and Chittagong also were reported to be useless.
