We don't want to make too much of the child's heart condition in his presence, because it may give him an inferiority complex, so my husband and I do not reply when people make remarks.

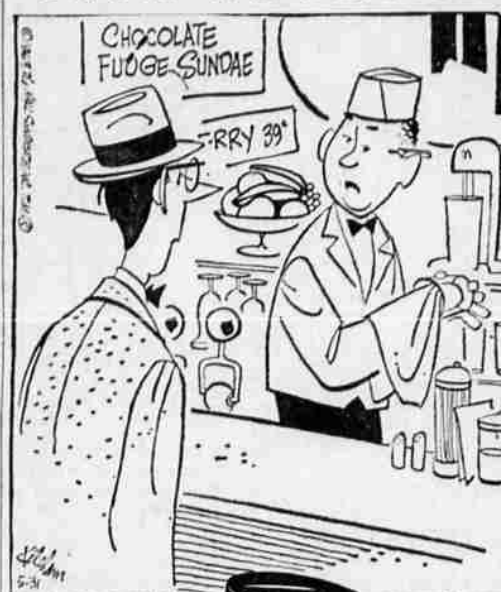

Pentagon Says People Safe From Radiation

WASHINGTON (UPI)—The Pentagon said today that detonation of Nike-Zeus warheads against an oncoming enemy missile would not endanger populations below the point of intercept.

The Defense Department said, in response to inquiries, that "the danger from (radioactive) fallout from our defensive missiles is insignificant compared to that from an unopposed enemy missile."

The statement was aimed at countering interpretations placed on remarks by Defense Secretary Robert S. McNamara concerning radioactive fallout problems that might result from use of the Nike-Zeus anti-missile missile.

McNamara Testifies
Testimony by McNamara before the House defense appropriations subcommittee was interpreted to mean that the Nike-Zeus itself would create fallout requiring an extensive system of shelters to protect civilians.

"I think I am right in saying our own program will create a fallout problem," McNamara told the House group.

Solon Asks Earnings Boost For Social Security Taxes

WASHINGTON (UPI)—An influential Democrat has called on Congress to strengthen the "trust funds" of the Social Security program by requiring bigger tax contributions from persons earning more than \$4,000 a year.

The proposal came from Rep. Wilbur D. Mills, D-Ark., powerful chairman of the House Ways & Means Committee which has legislative jurisdiction over Social Security benefits and taxes.

Mills presented in the House Wednesday a bill that would apply the Social Security job-tax to the first \$5,400 in annual earnings. Only the first \$4,000 now is taxed.

Effective next Jan. 1, Mills' proposal would mean tax increases of \$21.75 a year for those employees earning as much as \$5,400 annually. Self-employed persons earning that much would pay \$32.40 more. Employers would have to match any increase in the tax contributions of their employees.

The bill, which Mills is sponsoring without administration endorsement, is designed to improve the actuarial soundness of the Social Security program. Al-

though the increase in the taxable earnings base would result in boosting the maximum cash benefits that workers can qualify for, almost all of the remaining revenue would be used to reduce to negligible size the long-range deficits now foreseen for the program's "trust funds."

Should Mills' bill begin moving through Congress, it would almost certainly become the focal point of a struggle for enactment of President Kennedy's proposal that Social Security benefits be expanded to include hospitalization insurance for persons 65 and older.

Conceivably, the bill could serve as the vehicle for enactment of some version of this program. Mills is publicly on record against the proposal to provide hospitalization insurance through the Social Security program.

The Social Security tax rate for employees and for their employers now is 3½ per cent. To finance the existing scale of benefits it is scheduled to law to climb to 4½ per cent in 1966 and to 4½ per cent in 1968. The rate for the self-employed, now 5.4 per cent, is scheduled to reach 6.2 per cent in 1966 and 6.8 per cent in 1968.

Gas Share Set

SALEM (UPI)—In eight years Portland should be getting the same share of motor vehicle revenues that other cities now get.

A city's share is based on its population. Portland currently gets 70 per cent of what other cities get. A bill to raise its share to 100 per cent by 1971 was signed into law Wednesday by the governor.

Catholic Leaders Oppose JFK Education Proposals

WASHINGTON (UPI)—Catholic educators said Wednesday that President Kennedy's education proposals would discriminate against children in non-public schools and lead to deterioration of the nation's parochial school system.

They said Catholic schools educate about 6 million children to standards set by the states and thus, in effect, provide a \$2.5 billion annual subsidy to the public schools systems.

The views were presented to a Senate education subcommittee by Msgr. Frederick G. Hochwalt, educational director for the National Catholic Welfare Conference. His testimony was supplemented by Msgr. John B. McDowell, superintendent of the Pittsburgh Catholic Schools, and by Bernard J. Powers, a teacher in South Hills Catholic High School in Mt. Lebanon, Pa.

Hochwalt stressed that the Catholic Welfare Conference "is not an outright proponent of federal aid to education." But if Congress decides that federal aid is
