

P. Snell Clocks 1:48.0

LOS ANGELES (UPI) — New Zealander Peter Snell, in analyzing his easy victory Friday night in the half mile, remarked today that American Jim Beatty "has nothing to lose" if the pair meet next week in the celebrated mile event.

"If he beats me," said Snell, "we will be back where we started before Modesto."

The New Zealander easily won the half-mile last night in the Southern Pacific Amateur Athletic Union (SPA)U meet held at Occidental College. He was clocked in 1:48.0, well over his record of 1:45.1.

Beatty chalked up an equally easy triumph in the mile with a time of 4:00.8. He set his own pace and was timed in 1:58.8 for the half mile, but drew away in the third lap to finish a full six seconds ahead of second place Leroy Neal of Occidental.

Despite the absence of strong competition for either man, Snell said he "was very satisfied. I didn't intend to go out after my own record, although the time was lower than you people said I was going to run."

Snell and Beatty are expected to compete in the mile at the Compton Relays June 7. Snell ran a blistering 3:54.9 at the Modesto Relays last weekend, beating Beatty, who placed third.

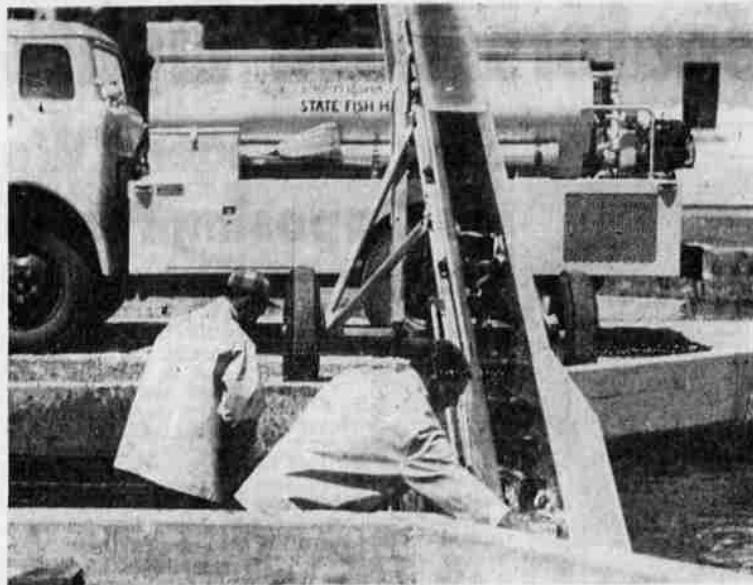
The crowd of 4,500 received perhaps its biggest thrill when UCLA's decathlon record holder, C. K. Yang, tried three times to clear 16 feet 8 inches in the pole vault.

On his first try at that height, Yang hit the bar with his thigh on his way up. On his other attempts, he got closer to clearing the bar but hit it with his chest. He finally had to settle for a leap of 16-1, good for first place.

Ralph Boston scored an easy win in the broad jump at 24 feet 10 inches and came back to take the high hurdles in the time of 14.0 seconds. Parry O'Brien edged Dave Davis in the shot put with a throw of 61 feet, 8 1/2 inches. Davis threw the 16-pound ball 61-5 1/2.

New Truck Giants Have Zany Completed Base Running Team For Stock

SAN FRANCISCO (UPI)—Saturday's Sports:

The San Francisco Giants must have the zaniest bunch of base runners since the old days of the Brooklyn Dodgers and Babe Herman.

In Cincinnati the other night, two runners, Billy O'Dell and Jose Pagan were thrown out at home plate on a double by rookie Cap Peterson.

Cincinnati catcher Don Pateletich must have thought he was in a football game as Pagan came in to do the blocking, followed by O'Dell. But the backstop got them both on the one throw.

This isn't the first time the modern Giants have been guilty of faulty base running. When the club first moved to San Francisco, thirdbase coach Herman Franks was literally booed out of the major leagues by the fans who thought he was to blame for so many men being thrown out at home plate.

Neglected Coaches

Then, with Franks gone, the fans found out that the Giants in

general, and the Latin Americans in particular, don't believe in watching the third base coach, at all. They run with their heads down. Willie Mays is another on his own. He often roars past third base coach Whitey Lockman while Whitey has the "stop" sign reaching for the skies.

But the Giants muddle through, even though they throw a run or two away nearly every game with some questionable antics on the base paths.

The Los Angeles Angels have a minor league hurler, pitching for tri-cities of the Northwest League, who strikes out just about half the side in every game. In 34 innings he has fanned out 47 batters. His name is Dick Wentz, a right-hander.

Kilmer Doubtful

Halback Bill Kilmer of the San Francisco Forty Niners, injured last December in an auto accident, still is a doubtful prospect for the game this fall. His leg has healed, but an infection has been slowing up recuperation.

As Giants manager Alvin Dark says, the Los Angeles Dodgers series has to be the best in baseball. In six games played so far this season, the attendance has been just shy of the quarter million mark. There isn't another rivalry like that in major league baseball.

A \$125,000 bonus pitcher, a former American Leaguer and a guy named Smith today were the pitching stars of the Pacific Coast League.

And the goat? None other than sockless Salt Lake City which suffered its 16th loss in a row to come within one defeat of tying the PCL record for consecutive losses, set by Sacramento in 1925.

Right-hander Pete Smith set down Salt Lake with only two hits. The 23-year-old pitcher from Natick, Mass., fanned seven and walked two to bring his record to 5-4.

Stan Johnson doubled to score Smith with Seattle's run in the sixth inning. Smith had walked and advanced to second during a successful rundown of a Seattle player who was picked off second.

Six-Hitter For Krausse

In other games Lew Krausse of Portland, signed by the Kansas City Athletics for an estimated \$125,000, pitched a six-hitter in beating Spokane 9-2 and Dallas-Ft. Worth's Lee Stange, who had a 4-3 record with the Minnesota Twins last season, shut out Hawaii 4-0 on five hits.

Rain forced postponement of the San Diego at Oklahoma City game.

Outfielder Ken Harrison of Portland socked a homer, double and two singles to drive in three runs. Portland's Ron Debus also collected four hits, including a triple and double. Gene Wallace hit a bases empty homer for Spokane in the ninth.

Krausse, who evened his record at 4-4, struck out six and walked

three in going the full route. Phil Ortega (2-4) was the starter and loser for Spokane. He was removed in the fourth inning when Debus singled off his leg.

Bellino Provides Punch

Stange, a right-hander, limited Hawaii to five hits in winning his fourth game against a single loss. Infielder Ray Bellino provided the plate punch for Dallas-Ft. Worth. He doubled home three runs in the fourth.

Dallas-Ft. Worth infielder Cesar Tovar singled in the first inning to stretch his consecutive game hitting streak to 22. The victory gave the Texans a half-game edge over second-place San Diego in the Southern Division.

Hawaii's Fred Newman (2-5) was the loser.

Denver flexed its muscles with an 10-3 romp over Yakima of the Northwest League in an exhibition battle. Former Yakima player Ethan Blackaby paced the winners' 20-hit attack with a homer and a pair of singles.
