Giants Meet Hot Cubs Nine Today

CHICAGO (UPI) — San Francisco's Billy O'Dell, who hasn't lost one yet, tries for victory number nine today against the rejuvenated Chicago Cubs in the opener of a four-game series at Wrigley Field.

O'Dell should have a couple of problems. First a new forearm, Chicago has a fine 27-23 mark and has served notice that it no longer will lie down and play dead for anybody. The Cubs still could use a little more hitting, but seemingly boast as classy a crew of hurlers as the Giants must face all year.

That brings the Giants to their second problem. The Cubs are sending hard-throwing Larry Jackson to the hill today. He is always one of the Senior Loop's most solid starters and boasts a 7-5 mark this year.

But O'Dell and the Giants have a few things going for them, too. San Francisco, idle Monday, has emerged with a solid grip on first place and a 31-19 mark. St. Louis is two games back and Los Angeles and the Cubs four lengths off the pace.

San Francisco hitters are displaying the kind of power that has opposing managers reaching for the aspirin tablets. The list of the league's current home run leaders reads about like manager Alvin Dark's batting order with four of the six leaders being Giants.

There's Felipe Alou with 12 roundtrippers, Ed Bailey, who has played about half the time and still collected 11, and Orlando Cepeda and Willie Mays with 10 each. What with Willie McCovey not far back with 8, Giants partisans are talking of the possibility of having five players with 30 or more roundtrippers. The old record is three on one club with 30 or more.

Mays jumped into the homer derby by crashing a trio of four-masters against St. Louis Sunday. He banged six hits in the series to hike his batting average from a pallid .226 to a more promising .254.

Mays has always been a streak hitter and if he is off on one of his patented rampages, the Giants may be ready to open a little more daylight between themselves and the rest of the loop.

For as pitcher Billy Pierce put it after Mays' big show Sunday: "Well, our big boy is going now... maybe we're on way."

Americans Show Well In British Amateur Golf

ST. ANDREWS, Scotland (UPI) — Billy Joe Patton, the tournament co-favorite, and two fellow members of the United States Walker Cup team swing into action today in the British Amateur golf championship.

Patton, of Morganton, N.C., Bob Gardner of Essex Fells, N.J., and Charley Smith of Gastonia, N.C., watched from the sidelines Monday as 15 other

Yanks survived their opening round tests. Nine U.S. players were eliminated.

Patton, bracketed with Scotland's Ronnie Slade as the joint favorites, drew James Pirie of Scotland as his opening opponent.

Va., Dick Sikes of Springdale, Ark., Downing Gray Jr. of Pensacola, Fla., George Blocker of Jal, N.M., and Dr. Ed Updegraff of Tucson, Ariz.
