

# 'Y' Diamond Lake Boys Camp Open

Boys in grades four to eight are invited this week to sign up for YMCA resident camp at Diamond Lake. Special leader-training opportunities are also available to ninth and 10th grade boys. The full session operates from July 6-16, including an extended campout near Mt. Bailey for the last three days. A shorter period for the younger campers ends July 13. Boys need very little special equipment and no previous camping experience to be able to attend.

The camping program is informal and provides opportunities for boys to improve their outdoor living skills, while living in a cabin group of eight boys and an adult counselor.

Highlights of the session are usually the group hiking excursions on Mt. Thielson and Mt. Bailey. Other activities include fishing, canoeing, handicraft, chapel, campfire programs, archery and riflery.

This year the camp will be under the direction of Leon Clark, YMCA general secretary. Several qualified adults will serve as volunteer group counselors. The camp cook will be Mrs. Grace Whitlow, of Lucile O'Neill School. Camp nurse will be Mrs. C. A. Musselman.

A selected number of ninth and 10th grade boys will be eligible for apprentice experience in camp leadership, called counselor-in-training. Their camp session will be divided between leader-training classes, assistance

to adult staff and recreational periods. Those "CITs" selected from applications will be picked on the basis of leadership potential and interest in outdoor living.
