

Speech Correction Courses Help North Lake Pupils

PORT ROCK—Benefits of speech therapy were noted recently when Dr. Leon Mulling, director of the speech and hearing center at Southern Oregon College, Ashland, met with several North Lake County pupils and their parents at a clinic in Paisley.

Among the six students at Paisley was Darla Judd of Fort Rock School, who had difficulty with several sound pronunciations.

"You are coming along so well I think we can graduate you next fall," said Dr. Mulling. This brought a smile from Darla who has been working hard to correct her speech. Substituting correct sounds for incorrect ones long is a tedious task.

Working with Darla have been her mother, Mrs. Robert Judd,

and a neighbor, Mrs. Bud Parks, who has had some training in this work. Completing the team is her teacher, Mrs. Lawrence Rice, who finds her use of phonics and her reading improved.

child apart improves the whole personality, experts say. A key to success in speech improvement is regularity in working with the pupil. Interesting rhyme games and stories make it fun for both teacher and child, even though it is approached as a work time.

The May clinics at Paisley and Lakeview were a follow-up to ones held last fall. Children are referred by local doctors and teachers. Dr. Mulling gives a diagnosis and then instructs parents in techniques to improve speech. Twenty-five children were enrolled in the May clinics compared with 35 to 40 in the fall.

Dr. Mulling has an assignment in Guam for the summer. His work there will be to set up a speech clinic for cleft palate chil-

dren. He will return for the fall term at Southern Oregon College, where he is chairman of the department of speech and drama.

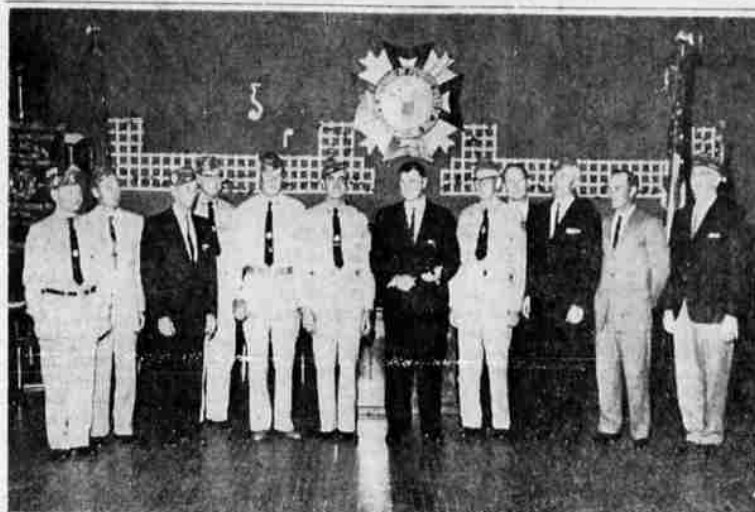
EMPLOYEE SELECTION

SPACE ON EARTH

GREENBELT, Md. (UPI)—Two of the largest pieces of "outer space" ever created on earth are nearing completion here at NASA's Goddard Space Flight Center.

Space conditions will be simulated in two enormous stainless steel tanks which will be the main features of a \$15 million facility now being built at Goddard. Satellites and other large space vehicles far too big for most existing simulators will be tested inside the nearly six-story-tall cylindrical chambers.

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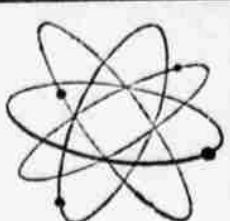
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
