The Klamath Falls Hawks, after blowing a 5-0 lead, nipped the Ashland team 6-5 Wednesday night in Southern Oregon American Legion action when second baseman John Crume hit the first pitch of the seventh inning out of the park for a home run.

The victory gave the Hawks a 2-0 record and the lead in the young league. The Klamath Falls, who play Medford Saturday night at Gem Stadium, are 1-0 as are Tri-City and Grants Pass. The loss left Ashland at 0-3.

The Hawks had built up a 5-0 lead only to let errors and mental mistakes ruin the big lead. The game was tied going into the bottom of the ninth when Crume stepped up and slammed the first pitch over the left centerfield barrier for the win. He had come in as a pinch hitter for Mike Spiker.

The Hawks jumped on starting pitcher John Rhoads for a single run in the first inning. After one was out Rich Bath reached second on an error by the left fielder, Mac Cunningham singled him home for the run.
