Britain Demands Full Study Of Possible Security Break

LONDON (UPI)—Britain's Labor party today demanded a full-scale investigation of War Minister John Profumo's resignation in a sex scandal that shook the British government.

The opposition party called for an inquiry in parliament into any possible breach of security resulting from Profumo's relations with a red-haired playgirl who also was friendly with a Soviet assistant naval attaché.

At the same time Queen Elizabeth waived protocol so that Profumo would not have to go through the ceremony of appearing before her to hand in his seals of office.

Leads Labor Attack
Labor party leader Harold Wilson said he would open the attack personally.

The Labor party move heightened the furor over the resignation of Profumo, who admitted Wednesday night that he lied when he told parliament last March 22 there had been no "impropriety" in his relations with Christine Keeler, 21.

Party leaders said they were particularly concerned about Miss Keeler's friendship with Capt. Eugene Ivanov, assistant Soviet naval attaché, at a time when she also was seeing Profumo. Ivanov was recalled to Moscow last December.

Opposition Unlikely
It was not considered likely that the ruling Conservative party would attempt to block the debate of the Profumo case, which could lead to a censure vote against the government.

Profumo's attorneys disclosed today that he had asked to be excused from the formal ceremony of appearing before the queen as scheduled by protocol next week. The queen, it was learned, had granted the request.

Wilson said the Labor party is interested primarily in the security aspects of the Profumo case rather than in the propriety of the former war minister's personal life.

Agents At Work
As the opposition made its move against the government, Britain's Secret Service already was reported at work investigating any possible threat to the nation's security as a result of Profumo's relations with the playgirl, whose friends ranged from those in high society to Negroes from the West Indies.

Prime Minister Macmillan, vacationing in Scotland, was reported to have ordered the Secret Service into action.

In another case involving Miss Keeler — but not Profumo — a London court today jailed Aloysius (Lucky) Gordon, a colored Jamaican jazz singer, for three years for assaulting Miss Keeler.

At the end of Gordon's trial the judge, Commissioner Sir Ernest Goodman Roberts, said Gordon's allegations against Miss Keeler in court Thursday were unjustified.

Among other things, Gordon had said she was a call girl.

Civil Defense Director Plans Resignation As County Eyes Shift To Part-Time Effort

Effective June 30, the Klamath County Civil Defense Office will not operate on a full-time basis, Joe Searles, county civil defense director told the Herald and News Thursday.

The move is the result of an \$8,000 slash in the local CD budget which will go into effect at the beginning of fiscal year, 1963-64, commencing July 1. The new budget prepared recently by the county budget committee and the county court shows that funds allocated for local civil defense for 1963-64 has been set at \$3,339, compared to \$11,975.36 for the last fiscal year.

The cutback of CD funds in Klamath County follows a trend toward the deemphasizing of civil defense which started early this year in some other Oregon counties. The deemphasizing began as the result of the failure of some statewide CD organizations to effectively handle the emergencies that developed during the Columbus Day storm.

Such was not the case in Klamath County, where the civil defense office operated efficiently during the natural disaster, evidence has proved, Searles said. Searles, county CD director for the past four years and former assistant fire chief of the Suburban Fire Department, indicated early today that he would not continue in his present post on a part-time basis.

A reliable source said that the \$3,339 CD budget for this coming fiscal year was to provide the salary for a part-time CD director and maintain equipment purchased for civil defense through federal and county matching funds.

It is not the intention of the county to walk away from valuable equipment such as vehicle radio equipment in operation at the county road department and sheriff's office, a portable hospital, and other items which would be indispensable in the event of a natural disaster, the spokesman said.

The administrative and operating costs of civil defense are shared equally by the county and federal governments with costs for equipment also being provided by the two governments on a prescribed scale.

Searles said that in order to qualify for federal matching funds a report outlining the county CD program for the coming year must be submitted to the Regional Office of Civil Defense, Everett, Wash., before June 30.

Searles added that as a result of the budget slash federal funds may not be forthcoming to the county this year. Without an adequate budget there can be no CD program, and without a program matching funds will not be available, he explained. Searles said he was without a program to submit to the regional office.

In a prepared statement, Searles said: "I have been informed by the County Court that a full-time civil defense office and director will not be continued after June 30, so I am looking for other work. Any further information on what the County Court intends to do about the local CD program will have to come from them."

"I understand some counties that have a full-time director will continue on without any changes. I also understand that federal matching funds for director's salaries, and administrative expenses will still be available to counties."

"It is possible we could lose some equipment if local civil defense activities are drastically reduced. How much equipment, I would not know. I am not happy with the situation, because any plan less than what we already have would certainly not be adequate in the event of a nuclear attack."

"This talk that has been started about being cremated in fallout shelters makes it appear that it is hopeless to try to convince some people that fallout shelters were never meant to be bomb shelters offering blast or heat protection, and that they are exactly what their name implies — shelter from radioactive fallout."

"If a nuclear bomb should happen to explode on a prime target, those within range of the heat and initial radiation have had it, it is just as simple as that. However, Klamath Falls is not a prime target area."
