

House Tells Secretary To Negotiate Intertie

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The House Reclamation subcommittee voted today to direct Interior Secretary Stewart L. Udall to negotiate with private power companies over construction of a Pacific Coast power intertie.

Meanwhile, a California private power official appeared before another House committee to accuse Udall of seeking to dictate at the point of a "loaded gun" the terms under which private utilities might build transmission lines between the Pacific Northwest and California.

The reclamation subcommittee amended the Senate-passed Pacific Northwest Power preference bill to direct Udall to "exhaust every possible effort" to reach agreement on non-federal proposals to build the lines to carry Columbia River power as far south as Los Angeles.

"The subcommittee did not take final action on the bill intended to pave the way for construction of the West Coast intertie, but Chairman Walter Rogers, D-Tex., said a vote is expected Wednesday."

The attack on Udall, who already has said he is considering non-federal proposals for building the long-range transmission lines, was made by Fred Oldendorf Jr., president of the California Electric Power Co., in testimony before the House Public Works Ap-

propriations subcommittee.

Oldendorf and three other officials of firms making up the California Power Pool appeared in opposition to an Interior Department budget request of \$25.5 million to begin construction of two extra-high-voltage transmission lines between the Pacific Northwest and California.

Oldendorf questioned whether Udall was fair in asking for the appropriation to strengthen the department's hand in negotiations with private power companies for construction of all or part of the intertie.

"He wants to put a loaded gun at the utilities' heads so that he can dictate, not negotiate, terms that are acceptable to him," Oldendorf said. "This is not, and never should be, the traditional way of settling differences in this country."

The Interior Department is seeking to build a power line from Columbia River dams to the Oregon-California border, where it would tie into a line being built by Pacific Gas & Electric Co. and the Pacific Power and Light Co. of Portland.

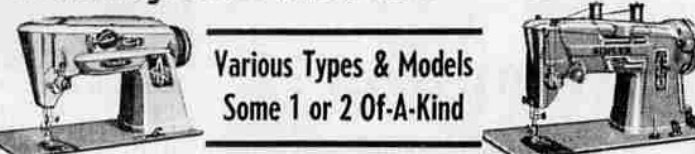
Hot dogs, hamburgers, chili and other snack foods will be available at the club house all day. Dinner will be served at the club Sunday evening if reservations are made before noon that day.

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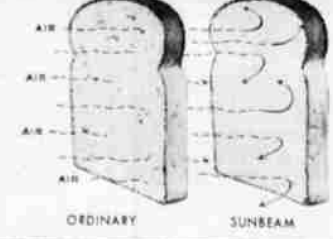
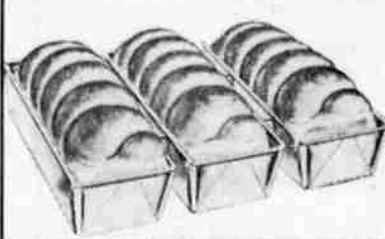
