The annual three-day fire fighting school in which firefighters of the Winema National Forest receive training to brush up on some of the skills involved in their duties gets started at 8 a.m., Tuesday, June 18, at the Sevenmile Guard Station, according to Dan Abraham, fire control officer of the national forest.
