

Subcommittee Approves Bill Giving Pacific Northwest Edge On Power

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The House Reclamation subcommittee today approved a Senate-passed bill to give the Pacific Northwest first call on federal power produced in the area.

The subcommittee approved by a vote of 15 to 3. The bill was sent to the full interior committee which is scheduled to consider it June 26.

The bill approved by the subcommittee was an amended version of legislation introduced by Sen. Henry M. Jackson, D-Wash., chairman of the Senate Interior Committee.

This legislation is designed to pave the way for construction of extra-high-voltage transmission lines to carry surplus power from Columbia River dams as far south as Los Angeles. It is intended to allay fears that power needed for industry in the Pacific Northwest would be drained away for use by public agencies in California.

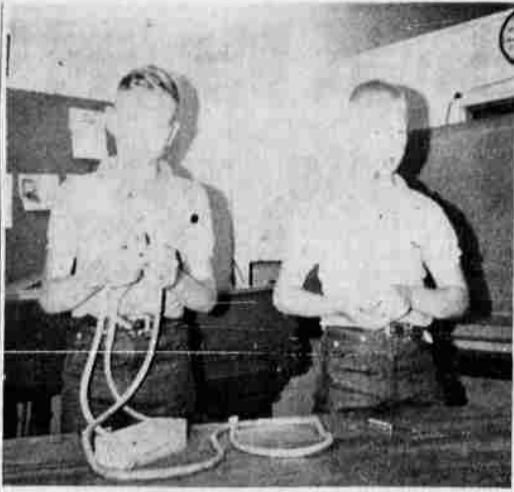
Under existing federal laws, public agencies in California would have preference over private industry to firm power in the Bonneville Power Administration system if an interstate were built.

The bill was amended to direct Interior Secretary Stewart L. Udall to seek agreement on non-federal proposals to build two long-range transmission lines. The Interior Department is seeking an appropriation of \$23.5 million to begin federal construction of the lines.

However, Udall has told Congress that the department already is considering private proposals for construction of the interstate. He said the appropriation was needed to strengthen the department's hand in negotiations for private construction of all or part of the transmission lines.

Greek King Plans To Visit Britain Despite Threats Of Demonstrations

ATHENS, Greece (UPI) — King Paul summoned political leaders today to seek a successor to Premier Constantine Caramanlis, who resigned in a dispute over a projected royal visit to Britain.

The King issued a proclamation Tuesday night reaffirming his intention to visit Britain July 9-12 with Queen Frederika, despite a threat of demonstrations by expelled Greeks and their British sympathizers.

Caramanlis had announced his resignation earlier, following a brief audience with the king at the royal palace which the premier said ended in "complete disagreement."

The premier had argued for weeks that the royal couple should postpone or cancel the trip rather than risk a repetition of demonstrations such as plagued Queen Frederika and Princess Irene when they went to London in late April for the wedding of Britain's Princess Alexandra.

The Greek queen and her daughter were accosted by demonstrators demanding the release of Greek political prisoners, some of whom have allegedly been in prison since the Communist bid for power in 1947.

On one occasion, Queen Frederika and Princess Irene were chased by angry demonstrators and forced to seek refuge in the London apartment of American actress Marti Stevens.
