# Teamster Leader Conviction Seen As Justice Victory

NEWARK, N.J. (UPI) — Asst. U.S. Atty. Richard Levin said Wednesday the conviction of Teamster leader Anthony (Tony Pro) Provenzano, was a victory for the Justice Department in its war against labor racketeers.

## APPROVE INSURANCE BILL

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The Senate Finance Committee Wednesday approved a bill to give World War II and Korean War veterans an opportunity to renew G.I. life insurance they have allowed to lapse.

Although the Senate has passed the measure at least five times previously, it always has died in the House.

Veterans Administration officials have said the plan would not cost the government any money because veterans would pay all the costs.

Levin also said he was "positive" that word did not leak to the jurors of the slaying of ex-Marine Walter Glockner in Hoboken two days after the trial started.

Glockner, 27, a member of a rebel group within Provenzano's 14,000-member local, was to have been a witness for the government at the trial.

He was gunned down in the street as he left his home the night after attending a meeting of anti-Provenzano Teamsters. The killing has not been solved. The next day, U.S. District Judge Robert Shaw ordered the jury locked up in a hotel after every session of the trial.

Levin said the U.S. marshal's office "did a superb job" of protecting the jury "from being contaminated" by news of the Glockner slaying, which might have swayed its opinions.

Provenzano said he knew nothing about Glockner's slaying and announced plans to provide scholarships for the dead man's two daughters.

Provenzano, regarded by some as the most powerful Teamster union official in the country next to International President James R. Hoffa, was visibly shaken by the jury's verdict of guilty.

"I feel fine, fine," he said gruffly as he stepped into his car following the trial. To newsmen's questions, the usually talkative union leader said tersely: "See my lawyer."

He is currently free under \$1,500 bail pending filing of a motion for a new trial June 26. He

could be sentenced to 20 years in prison and fined \$10,000.

## How To Play Top Bridge

One of the best ways to win at bridge is to get a silly contract and then make it, as this hand from the Southeastern championships in Miami, Fla., shows.

With 20 high card points, South decided to jump to two spades after North responded with one heart to the opening diamond bid.

From then on North turned him every way but loose and there was South at a nice slam contract that had only one defect. There were two natural trump losers.

South gazed at dummy somewhat mournfully, but not mournfully enough to tell East and West that his cause was hopeless.

Dummy's ace of clubs held the first trick and South played the ten of spades. East had a problem. He did not know that South was looking only at ace-nine-seven-three of spades and East decided that it behooved him to play his queen. South put on the ace and when the jack dropped from the West hand South was able to ruff out his last low club, pick up the rest of the trump suit with the loss of only one trick and chalk up the impossible slam.

East had been faced with a tough play, but he could have afforded a low card on that first spade lead just in case West did hold that singleton jack.
