Mexico City Rites Of Interest Locally

Mexico City was the setting for the April wedding of Martha Cabrera of that city and Estin Kiger Jr. of Klamath Falls. The bride is the daughter of General and Mrs. Manuel Cabrera. The bridegroom is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Estin Kiger.

The civil ceremony was held at the Cabrera home on April 26 with 12 witnesses present and the immediate family, relatives and neighbors. The religious ceremony was held April 27 at 6:30 in the evening in the Sacristy of the Metropolitan Cathedral with the Rev. Father Dunstan Stout officiating. The lengthy civil ceremony was entirely in Spanish, but out of courtesy to the bridegroom's parents, an English speaking priest was obtained and the religious ceremony was entirely in English.

The bride wore a pearl satin dress with a double train lined in the same material. Satin embroidered leaves of the same color covered the front of the dress from bodice to hemline. Her veil, dusted in powder to match her dress, was held in place by a

crystal tiara. The tiara was designed and made by the bridegroom. It matched the garland of crystal beads made to entwine the couple during part of the ceremony. Her only jewelry were silver and diamond earrings which her mother had worn at her own wedding. Only the bride had flowers at the religious ceremony. She carried a bouquet of pearl white roses with the stems encased in a silver tube. Orchids were worn by all the ladies attending the civil ceremony the evening before. A dinner dance reception was held at 9 p.m. that evening at the Salon "Corinto." The couple left the following day for an Acapulco honeymoon.

The bride is a graduate of Instituto Rafael Rossi and the University of America. She is presently employed as bilingual secretary to the president of Mazal Optico. The bridegroom is in his junior year at the University of America. They will spend July and August in Klamath Falls and return to Mexico City in September.

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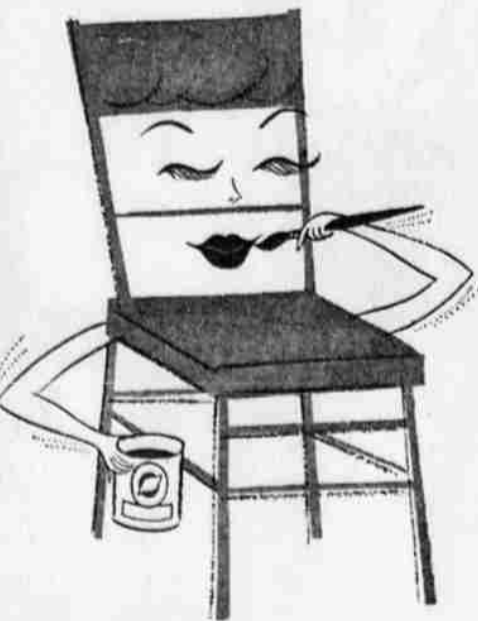
