'Worthless' Fish Have Value

The "worthless" Upper Klamath Lake chub or roach apparently has some value after all. Scientific value, that is, to medical technology students at OTI.

Once a year in a cooperative effort with the OTI Med. Tech. Department, Art Gerlach, area state fish biologist, spends a day at the big lake netting chubs for scientific research.

Most of the parasites are found in the host snails that chubs eat. The catch was small this year (only 12 fish), but there were plenty of parasites to serve the needs of the lab classes.

In the labs the students open the fish and inspect the stomach contents. They then examine the snails, which are a steady diet for chubs, and identify the individual parasites through the microscope.

He nets the fish for the OTI study and the school, in turn, the biologist knows if any unusual species of parasite has turned up in the lake that Gerlach doesn't know about.
