



IT'S EASY TO DO — A new type of dispenser for decorating cakes is to be found in the food markets, a free-piston pressure can that eliminates the old bulky, unhandy squeeze bag or tube so difficult for many to use. It can be held in one hand and produces a smooth-flowing stream of icing, not a spray or foam. It has been perfected by a cake mixture company and makes cake decorating fun. There are four little plastic tips to make stars, buds and leaves, and two sizes of writing, large and small. The frosting comes in a variety of pretty pastel shades. This Angel Food Cake requires one package of mix, one package of pink prepared icing and one can each of pink and green cake decorator frosting. It's as simple as that to give a professional look to your cake.

Cowboy Biscuits

Baking pan, 9x13-inch.
Baking sheet.
Six large biscuits.
Preheated 450 degrees oven.
1/4 cup (1/2 stick) butter
2 cups flour
1 tablespoon baking powder
3/4 teaspoon salt
1/2 cup (1 stick) butter
1 1/4 cups buttermilk
Place 1/2 cup butter in pan and

place in oven just long enough to melt. Sift together flour, baking powder and salt. Cut in 1/2 cup butter until mixture is mealy; stir in buttermilk to make a soft dough. Turn out onto a lightly floured board and pat into a 9x12-inch rectangle; cut 3x2, giving six biscuits each three inches wide and six inches long. Remove one tablespoon melted butter from pan; set aside for tops of biscuits. Place biscuits in pan, close together and drizzle reserved one tablespoon melted butter over them, bake about 20 minutes. Remove from pan, split and place on baking sheet; toast in oven before topping with ranch steak, or other entrees such as stew, chicken fricasse, a la king, creamed tuna, etc.

MOLDY

Molded beef salad is hot weather fare. In a saucepan, sprinkle 2 envelopes of unflavored gelatin on 1 (10 1/2 ounce) can of condensed beef broth to soften. Place over low heat. Stir until gelatin dissolves completely. Remove from heat. Add 1 1/2 cups of tomato juice, 1/4 cup of water, 2 tablespoons of lemon juice and 1/4 teaspoon of celery seed. Chill to consistency of unbeaten egg white. Fold in 1 cup of finely diced cooked beef, 2 tablespoons of chopped green pepper, and 2 tablespoons of chopped green onion. Pour into 1 quart mold. Chill 4 hours or until firm. Unmold on lettuce. Serve with dairy sour cream. Serves 4 to 6.

Garden Bouquet

This variable recipe is worth shouting from the roof tops about, but if you're a good cook instead of a roof top shouter you'll want to make it again and again, using whatever is at hand. Of course the best thing to have on hand is convenient canned tomato sauce, always on friendly terms with vegetables, as in this dish where it combines with pineapple to give a tantalizing new flavor, different from both barbecue and sweet - sour sauces. It is ideal to serve with a barbecue meal—the flavor is a perfect complement to grilled meats and you cook all the vegetables in a single skillet. Though it looks colorful and handsome when made with round, orange carrot slices and long green string beans, you can substitute lima beans, corn, and summer squash in the same succulent sauce; or celery with kidney beans and onions. Possibilities are endless—look in the refrigerator to see what leftovers are waiting. Try this new sauce with almost any vegetable combination—there'll be requests for repeats.

GARDEN BOUQUET SKILLET DISH

1 tablespoon butter
1 medium onion, chopped
1 (8-ounce) can tomato sauce
1 cup thinly sliced fresh carrots
1 (12-ounce) package frozen green beans, french cut
1 (8 1/2 ounce) can crushed pineapple and juice
1 teaspoon salt
In a skillet, saute onion in butter until golden brown. Add remaining ingredients; cover and simmer 15 minutes or until vegetables are tender. Serves 4 to 6.



GREEN PEPPER TIME — While green bell peppers are usually in the markets, those plucked from your own garden are delicious. From either source they are thrice-good if stuffed with sweet corn and baked with cheese.

Corn-Peppers Is Good Dish

A delicious vegetable dish to accompany fish, meat or poultry. Green pepper, corn, cheese, onion and a faint touch of curry are the teasing flavors in this easy-made dish.
CORN STUFFED PEPPERS
4 or 5 medium-large green peppers
Boiling salted water
1 (12 oz.) can vacuum pack whole kernel corn
1 1/2 cups milk
2 tablespoons finely chopped onion
2 tablespoons finely chopped pimiento
1 teaspoon seasoned salt
1/2 teaspoon pepper
1/2 teaspoon curry powder
2 eggs, beaten
Cheddar Cheese Spread
Cut tops off peppers and remove seeds. Parboil pepper cases in boiling salted water 3 minutes. Drain upside down while preparing filling. Turn corn into a saucepan. Add milk, onion, pimiento, salt, pepper and curry powder. Heat to simmering. Stir in the beaten eggs and about 2 tablespoons cheese spread; remove from heat. Cut a thin slice from bottom of each pepper, if necessary, so they will stand upright. Place pepper cases in a small greased baking dish. Fill with corn pudding mixture, then top each one with cheese spread. Add 2 or 3 tablespoons water to bottom of baking dish. Bake in a moderate oven (350 degrees F) 25 to 30 minutes or until filling is set. Makes 4 or 5 servings.
