Sound Bids Usually Win

As North put down his hand as dummy he remarked, "Well, partner, you sure trapped me beautifully. You couldn't act over East's five heart bid and then when I chose to bid five spades you went right to six."

South did not reply. He was waiting for East's lead on the second trick. When East continued hearts, South ruffed, drew trumps and claimed his slam.

He still did not bother to answer North. Success had answered for him.

In most instances a bid that traps your partner should be avoided, but there are exceptions and South's pass over five hearts and bid of six spades were both logical.

South had used that rare bid, the forcing pass. He had decided that if he bid five spades his partner would probably be unable to go to six because he, South, was looking at a singleton heart and North might well hold a couple of cards in that suit. South also decided that if North doubled five hearts it would show heart strength. In that case South might not even make five spades and it would be better to play at five hearts doubled.

However, North did bid five spades. South was sure that all North's high cards would be working spades and South bid the slam with every expectation of success.

Q—The bidding has been:

Q—You, South, hold:
♠AQ65 ♥K32 ♦AQ2 ♣A65
What do you do?

A—Pass. You have shown 18 or 19 points by your jump to 3NT. Your partner is willing to play three no-trump. It should be all right with you also.

Mount Shasta, Dunsmuir Decline To Accept Airport Offer

MOUNT SHASTA—Mayor Gino Marconi told Mount Shasta City Council members that his committee, at a meeting with the Dunsmuir City Council, had decided neither city wanted Mott Airport under the present tax situation.

Siskiyou County is ready to deed the airport to the cities jointly. Marconi went on to say that \$89 had been the income from the

airport last year, with a \$2500 gas tax refund, but it is not guaranteed and could be as low as \$1900. Councilman Dave McDaniel was appointed to research laws as to the possibility of keeping the airport off the tax roll. Tax rates will be set in July and a report given before that time.

In other business, the council was advised that \$1,600.74 was needed to add to the \$350 already

posted in court to defray expenses of court costs in the recent Palmer Road water-sewer line court battle. Ross Bigler, attorney for the Palmer Road people, submitted a statement for \$1,044.70, and L. N. Lorenzen, city attorney, turned his in for \$914.04. Money was obtained from appropriations not already used and ordered paid.

Resolutions withdrawing Hercu-

les, Hennessy, and Needels annexes from Mount Shasta fire district were adopted, and a report on group insurance bids for city employees was tabled for further study. Two resolutions which appointed Eugene Lensing as poundmaster at a \$360 monthly salary and Joseph Herzog as radio dispatcher at \$200 a month, were approved.

A petition by Richard Modolo

requesting Vista Blanca annexation was read, and a protest hearing was set for July 26 at 8 p.m. in the Mount Shasta city hall. The first reading of an ordinance regarding 15-minute parking in the post office vicinity on the west side of Chestnut Street was also heard.

each will be needed for the Rock-fellow annex water line, according to Charles Echols, supervisor of public works, to give the residents adequate fire protection and reduce their insurance rates.
