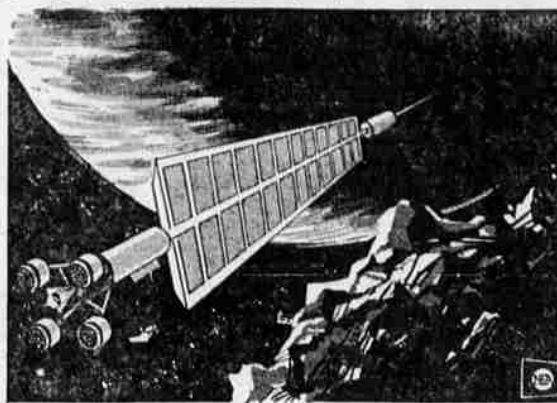
FIRST CHEMICAL

THE WIZARDS OF SPACE (10)

Where once the roar and whine of great piston and jet engines was heard at Lewis Propulsion Laboratory of National Advisory Committee for Aeronautics, today the noiseless glow of a small electric rocket in a vacuum chamber symbolizes the mission assigned to Lewis Research Center, another major facility of National Aeronautics and Space Administration.

That mission is the development of new types of propulsion for spacecraft of the future. The 1,800 engineers and scientists at the 350-acre facility just west of Cleveland, Ohio, are exploring the potentials of chemical, electric and nuclear power for tomorrow's Mars ship.

Though their thrust is measured in but fractions of pounds, compared to the 7.5 million

pounds of Saturn V, the moon project booster, Lewis-developed engines may make a trip to Mars or Venus a matter of weeks, rather than years because they could operate steadily.

In second panel, a nuclear spaceship hovers near Mars' tiny outer moon, Deimos.

Chemical rockets will take man to the moon, but only some kind of electric rocket, powered by a nuclear reactor, will make intensive exploration of the solar system possible. Lewis is studying three types of electric propulsion. One engine, which uses ions—electrically atoms—for thrust, will be tested in 1963.

Lewis has also been given the task of developing the Centaur, a liquid hydrogen rocket on which several of NASA's space programs

are waiting. This helped nearly quadruple the center's budget from \$55 million in fiscal 1962 to \$200 million in 1963. For fiscal 1964, \$500 million is being asked.

Sixty miles to the west, near Sandusky, is Plum Brook Research Station, site of a nuclear reactor operated by Lewis. Here the effects of nuclear radiation on rocket engines and spacecraft components are being investigated.

Lewis also has a role in the Apollo moon program. Studies are being made on propellants for the landing craft and work has been done in the center's 8 x 6 wind tunnel (third panel) to study the effects of rocket engine blast on a simulated lunar surface.
