

Time Running Out To Refer Legislature's Tax Increase Program

SALEM (UPI) — The Citizens Committee for Economy and Equitable Taxation isn't going to have much time in which to circulate petitions to refer the legislature's tax increase.

The group, headed by J. Francis Howard, editor of weekly newspapers in Albany and Corvallis, isn't getting any help from the governor or legislative leaders.

Wednesday without signature. This is the deadline by which Hatfield must either sign measures, or let them become law without his signature.

Deadline Sept. 2

A measure must be referred within 90 days of the end of the legislative session. The deadline is Sept. 2.

If Hatfield lets the measure become law without signature next Wednesday, 23 days already will have elapsed.

Jack Thompson, elections supervisor for the secretary of state, said the tax measure will be forwarded to Atty. Gen. Robert Y. Thornton as soon as he receives it.

Thornton has 10 days in which to prepare a ballot title and statement of purpose.

During this period Howard has to re-file his referral notice, because his original petition was filed last Monday, before the measure became law.

Could Take 53 Days

After Thornton assigns the ballot title, there is a 20-day period during which his title may be appealed. The full process could take up as many as 53 of the 90 days Howard's group has to circulate petitions.

But Howard's group may find 37 days is ample time. The last time a tax measure was referred it took only two weeks to get the necessary signatures.

Hatfield already is on record in opposition to referral because it would result in a special session of the legislature.

"If the legislature couldn't draft a better bill in 141 days, there's no reason to believe they could do better in a special session," he said.

House Speaker Clarence Barton told Oregon Newspaper Publishers in Coos Bay Friday that rejection of the tax package could result in "the worst rise in property taxes in Oregon history."

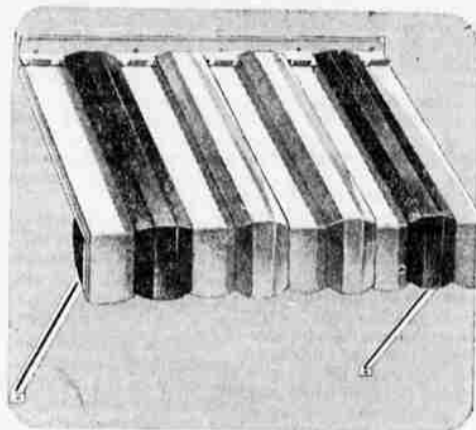

Italian Crisis Break Expected

ROME (UPI) — President Antonio Segni planned to swear in Premier-designate Giovanni Leone and his cabinet today, giving Italy a new government in time for President Kennedy's visit June 30.

The move was expected to break Italy's worst political crisis in years at least long enough to get a new budget and give this country a leader to greet the American chief of state.

It was uncertain how long Leone, 54, and his minority cabinet of fellow Christian Democrats will be able to retain office after Kennedy leaves.

The new government, which appeared to shape up somewhat to the right of former Premier Amintore Fanfani's "center-left" coalition, must win a vote of confidence in parliament to remain in power.

Four Killed In Crashes

Four persons died and two others were injured in a violent two-car collision on a rain-slickened highway north of Independence Friday night.

The fatalities sent the state's death toll for the day to six.

Victims in the Independence crash were Mrs. Doris Colgan, 49, of Monmouth; Esther Sandoval, 17, and Rose Sandoval, 16, of Independence, and Sadie Peden, 16, of Independence.

Injured were Marie Eleanor Sandoval and Patricia Lee Elliott of Independence. Salem Memorial Hospital attendants said they suffered only abrasions and bruises.

Police said they did not know what caused the accident. Mrs. Colgan died in a Salem hospital. The bodies of the Sandoval girls were found in the wreckage and the Peden girl was discovered later after survivors told police there was another passenger in the car.
