Mouth-to-mouth artificial respiration has been credited with saving the lives of several persons in Oregon this year in incidents involving near-drownings.

This method of artificial respiration has been recommended for use on victims of all ages. Prompt action in administering this or some form of artificial respiration also has been stressed in situations involving suffocation, drowning or other mishaps.

The Klamath County Chapter of the American Red Cross has a continuing program of training in artificial respiration, and persons desiring to attend one of the classes may do so by calling the Klamath Falls Red Cross office. As soon as a group of from 15 to 20 persons has indicated interest in a course, qualified instructors are obtained to conduct the classes.

The Red Cross has explained the proper method of administering the mouth-to-mouth method in this manner:



STEP ONE

Clear the mouth of any foreign matter with the middle finger of one hand. With the same finger press the tongue forward.



STEP TWO

Place the child in a face-down, head-down position and pat him firmly on the back with the free hand. This should help dislodge any foreign matter in the air passage.



STEP THREE

Place the child on his back and use the middle fingers of both hands to lift the lower jaw from beneath and behind so that it juts out. Hold the jaw in this position and use one hand only.



STEP FOUR

Place your mouth over the child's mouth and nose, making a relatively leakproof seal, and breathe into the child with a smooth steady action until you observe the chest rise. As you start this action, move the free hand to the child's abdomen, between the navel and the ribs, and apply continuous moderate pressure to prevent the stomach from becoming filled with air.

Then when the lungs have inflated, remove your lips from the child's mouth and nose and allow the lungs to empty. Repeat this cycle keeping one hand beneath the jaw and the other hand pressing on the stomach at all times.

Continue at the rate of about 20 cycles per minute. After every 20 cycles, the operator should rest long enough to take one deep breath. If at any time you feel resistance to your breathing into the child and the chest does not rise, repeat step two, then quickly resume mouth-to-mouth breathing.

Nikita's Close Friend May Be His Successor

MOSCOW (UPI)—Soviet President Leonid Ilyich Brezhnev, considered one of Premier Nikita S. Khrushchev's strongest supporters and closest friends emerged as a leading candidate to succeed the 69-year-old Communist leader when he steps down from office.

At Friday's closing session of the Communist Central Committee meeting here, Brezhnev and presidium (poliburo) member Nikolai Podgorny were elected committee secretaries.

Western observers viewed the move as a possible first step toward making the energetic, busy-browed Soviet president the Communist party's "crown prince." As such, he would succeed deputy party leader and central committee secretary Frol Kozlov.

Kozlov, long considered the No. 1 candidate to step into Khrushchev's shoes, suffered a stroke and partial paralysis recently. It is uncertain whether he will ever be able to resume his duties.

Thus Brezhnev, 58, appeared to be emerging as a possible successor to Kozlov.

There has been some speculation among foreigners here that Khrushchev might be getting ready to give up some of his powers because of his age. But there has been nothing even resembling an official announcement.

In another development, the central committee threw its unanimous support to Khrushchev in his ideological battle against Red China. The committee is the highest political body in Russia.

The committee, in a statement published in Saturday's issue of the Communist party newspaper, Pravda, termed "groundless and slanderous" China's continuing attacks on Russia's line of "peaceful coexistence" with the West.

Mr. Taylor was born in Belleville, Kan., Aug. 15, 1908 and came to Klamath Falls from Nebraska in 1943. He was employed at the Palmerton Lumber Company as office manager until 1960.

He then went into business for himself and was associated with the Klamath River Lumber Company and the brokerage firm of Baxter, Hall and Taylor.

Illness forced his retirement from these activities and he returned to Palmerton as comptroller in 1961. When the firm dissolved he became office manager at the Modoc Lumber Company until December 1963.

In 1954 he went to Prineville to take over duties as office manager at the Ochoo Lumber Company, later returning to Klamath Falls for a short time before accepting an accounting post in Alturas.

During his years in Klamath Falls, Mr. Taylor served in all phases of community life. He was a member of school board District 2, treasurer of the Modoc Area Council, Boy Scouts; first president and board member of the Klamath County United Fund, past president of the Klamath Falls Lions Club, and past president of the Klamath Lutheran Church.

Memorial services will be conducted at the Federated Church in Alturas at 8 o'clock Sunday evening. Final services will be held at Klamath Lutheran Church at 2 p.m. Monday with Rev. Carl Olson, Alturas, and Rev. Malcolm Unseth, Klamath Falls, officiating.

Allies Denounce Attempts To Stop Refugees

BERLIN (UPI)—The Western Allies today denounced as "illegal" a new Communist East German attempt to halt the flight of refugees by creating a dead zone along the East-West Berlin border.

A Western Allied spokesman said the new travel restrictions "are the harshest step in the series of actions which have been taken since Aug. 13, 1961, to transform the Soviet Zone and the Soviet sector of Berlin into a vast concentration camp."

"Once again the East German Communist regime has demonstrated that its system can exist only through the application of measures of repression and the flagrant disregard of human rights," the spokesman said in the name of the U.S., British and French missions here.

The spokesman called the creation of the forbidden zone "illegal."

The spokesman said, however, the new measure "in no way limits the right of the Allies to move freely in greater Berlin."

The East German action placed the wall area out of bounds four days before President Kennedy's trip here. There appeared to be a connection between the new restrictions and Kennedy's visit Wednesday.

An order issued by Gen. Heinz Hoffman, East German defense minister, barred East Germans from approaching within about 100 yards of the Berlin wall.

Sammy Davis Home Robbed

HOLLYWOOD (UPI)—Gunmen posing as policemen Friday night forced their way into the home of Negro entertainer Sammy Davis Jr. and his wife, actress May Britt, and fled with more than \$5,000 in cash and jewelry, police reported.

Officers said the couple's daughter, Tracy Hillary, and son, Mark, and their grandmother were downstairs in the house and unaware of the drama upstairs.

The Davis maid, Leslie Lee Jackson, about 60, told police she answered a knock on the door and looked through a peephole. A man wearing a uniform and badge said he was a policeman investigating a prowler complaint in the neighborhood.

The man said he wanted to talk to the maid. When she opened the door another man threw a clock sack over her head and held a pistol to her face. She fell to the floor and was dragged inside police said.

The woman told officers she thought at least three men then went from room to room ransacking the house.

At least \$450 in cash, a diamond necklace valued at \$5,000 and other jewelry were missing. Police said Mrs. Davis told them she would have to determine the exact amount from insurance papers because her husband had some jewelry with him in Las Vegas, Nev., where he is entertaining.

Mrs. Davis was attending a charity premiere of "Cleopatra" when the incident occurred.

Oldest Home Dedicated

FORT ROCK (UPI)—The 9,000-year-old home of what may have been the first Oregonians was dedicated as a place of scientific interest Saturday by the U.S. National Park Service.

Fish Pact Unsettled

WASHINGTON (UPI)—The United States, Canada and Japan have ended a two week fisheries conference without resolving the key issue of whether Japan should be allowed to fish in areas currently reserved for North American fishermen.

The three delegations suggested another meeting on the North Pacific Fisheries in the fall. Japan said it hoped the meeting would be scheduled in September in Tokyo.

Stumbling block at the conference was the "abstention principle" in the 10-year-old International North Pacific Fisheries Convention, under which Japan cannot fish for certain species in areas of the eastern North Pacific ocean so long as U.S. and Canadian fishermen are fully utilizing the stocks.

Japan called the abstention principle irrational and said it could not continue with the present treaty. However, informed sources said Japan did not serve notice that it wanted to withdraw from the agreement. Any nation can terminate the pact on one year's notice.

Canada and the United States refused to scrap the abstention principle and criticized as too general a substitute pact proposed by Japan. They said problems could be solved within the present treaty.

In the final communique, the three delegations said they "considered that the conference had been very useful in promoting mutual understanding of the views of each of the three parties."
