

Mount Shasta Planning Gala Parade, Contest

MOUNT SHASTA—Committees are now making preparations for a gala July 4 celebration in Mount Shasta. Applications are being accepted for the Miss Mount Shasta contest, open to single girls 16 years old and over who live in Mount Shasta. Judging will take place July 4 in the concession booth area on East Castle Street, following the parade.

The winner will compete in the Miss Siskiyou contest in Yreka, with the winner there to enter the Miss Mount Shasta contest. Miss Mount Shasta will receive a formal, bathing suit, and a pair of shoes from the chamber of commerce. The Bear Claws will sponsor the July 4 parade. A trophy will be awarded to the best entry, with emphasis on originality. A special award will be presented to the best individual entry. To enter, participants are required only to assemble behind the Lamplighter at 10 a.m. July 4.

Another attraction will be the annual dance at the armory at 9 p.m. July 3, when the queen of the celebration will be crowned. Music will be by "The Shadows."

The annual July 4 marathon up the mountain will also be featured, with \$100 and a trophy offered by the chamber of commerce to the winner. That evening there will be a large fireworks display to conclude the festivities. Concession booths will be open downtown all day beginning July 3, closing at the time of the fireworks.

Motor Bike Laws Given

Parents were warned today that children under 16 should not be permitted to operate motor bikes on public streets and roads.

Since the motor bike is classified as a motor vehicle, the Department of Motor Vehicles said the same laws apply to its operation as those covering automobiles.

This means the motor bikes must be operated by a licensed driver at least 16 years old. A 15-year-old who holds an instruction permit still would not be able to drive the two-wheeler because the law specifically excludes use of an instruction permit to operate a motorcycle.

The department said that the growing popularity of the motorized two-wheelers brought about a 60.7 per cent increase in motorcycle registrations last year. Most of the increase is attributed to the motor bike.

Attorney Indicted In 'Murder For Hire' Case

ST. PAUL, Minn. (UPI) — A hearing 10 witnesses Tuesday, then returned an indictment at 10:35 p.m. EDT against T. Eugene Thompson, 35, who had insured his wife, Carol, an heiress in her own right, for \$1,061,000.

A Ramsey County grand jury charged with murder in the clubbing and stabbing of Mrs. Thompson, 34, and mother of four, in the Thompsons' fashionable suburban home March 6.

County Atty. William Randall said Thompson hired Norman Mastrian, 39, Minneapolis, an ex-convict and one-time client, to carry out the slaying. Mastrian, police said, in turn contacted Dick W.C. Anderson, 35, decorated Marine combat veteran and unemployed roofing salesman, to do the actual killing.

It was Anderson's detailed statement Thursday that led police to arrest Thompson at his summer cottage at Forest Lake Tuesday.

Thompson; and Theodore Elzerman, St. Paul police criminologist who examined a pistol used to beat her.

Also testifying were Lt. George Barkley, head of the St. Paul police homicide division; Richard Sharp, a burglary suspect whose statement linked Anderson to the crime; and Lawrence McMullen, Hennepin (Minneapolis) County sheriff's detective.

It was not expected that the case would go to trial before fall. Thompson took out Jan. 15 a 60-day term policy for \$50,000. Another policy, with Lloyd's of London, was for \$250,000 in travel and accident insurance. Thompson said he carried about \$400,000 in insurance on himself.

Funds To Carry On Work In Congo Assured By UN

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (UPI) — United Nations Secretary General Thant today was assured of funds to carry on the Congo and Middle East peace-keeping operations for at least six more months.

The 111-nation General Assembly was certain to give final approval to a complicated financial formula which was accepted by its budgetary committee Tuesday. The committee consists of all members of the assembly.

The overwhelming committee approval left the Soviet bloc and France in isolated opposition to the plan for financing peace operations.

The assembly is scheduled to act on the program Thursday, ending a six-week special session called to find means to erase a \$100 million deficit and improve the fiscal system. The budgetary committee winds up its business today.

Canada Will Get Warheads

OTTAWA (UPI) — An agreement with the United States for delivery of nuclear warheads to Canada is expected to be completed shortly, Prime Minister Lester B. Pearson said Tuesday.

Thant's authorization to spend money on the Congo and Middle East operations expires June 30. The 11 Soviet bloc countries and France found virtually no support in the committee vote for their constitutional position that peace-keeping costs must be levied by the Security Council and not by the assembly as was done in the case of operations in the Congo and the Middle East.

"As far as I know," Pearson said, "negotiations with Washington are proceeding very satisfactorily and expeditiously. We expect it will be all settled within a few days."

The plan authorizes Thant to spend \$42.5 million for the Congo and Middle East operations through the end of this year. The first \$5.5 million is to be assessed on the regular budgetary scale. For the remainder, 85 "underdeveloped" countries will be granted a 55 per cent reduction on their assessments. The resulting \$3.66 million deficit is to be met by voluntary contributions.

Such a concord would make possible delivery of American nuclear-tipped warheads to Canadian forces by the end of the summer.

Under the arrangement, Canadian forces at home and in Europe would acquire the weapons under a system of joint control with the United States.

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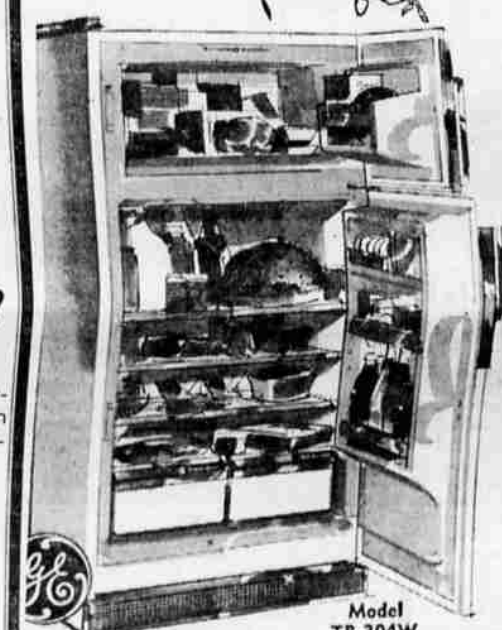
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
