

Communist Prisoner Wants Dress

PASSAIC, N.J. (UPI)—A woman, who spent more than three years in a Communist prison, had two things she wanted to do today—"buy a new dress and get my hair done."

Mrs. Helen Kozersky, 52, accused of Czechoslovakian authorities of spying for the Central Intelligence Agency, was reunited with her husband and three children Monday night at Idlewild Airport in New York.

The weeping woman clutched her 14-year-old daughter, Helen, close to her and exclaimed: "You've grown up."

Following the reunion at the airport with her husband, John, 55, and her daughter, and two sons, John Jr., 21, and Michael, 23, Mrs. Kozersky drove to the family home here.

She freshened up a bit and then attended a small party surrounded by her family and friends.

Mrs. Kozersky declined to discuss her experience in the Communist prison.

Mrs. Kozersky, who operated a small furniture importing business, was arrested while on a business trip to her native Czechoslovakia May 28, 1960.
