

Minor Hurts Suffered In Accident

A two-car collision near Thunder Beach Sunday resulted in no injuries to the occupants of the automobiles and minor damage to both vehicles, Oregon State Police have reported.

The accident developed as John Drake Jr., 15, accompanied by three others, was driving northbound along Highway 97 when he slowed down to cross the highway into the park.

As Drake turned the car left it moved into the path of an automobile operated by Zorka Sabovich, Arvin, Calif., which had left the northbound lane to pass the Drake vehicle.

Minor damage was to the left rear door of the Drake car and the front fender of the other car. Both vehicles left the scene under their own power.

Passengers in the Sabovich car were Lena Schutz, 64; Amy Mills, 72, and Elma Knowles, 69.

Occupants of the other vehicle were John Drake Sr., 61, Mrs. John Drake, 60, and Arthur Drake, 28, all of Bend.

Infantry Veterans To Observe Landing

Nearly 700 41st Infantry Division veterans of World War I and II will arrive in Gearhart, Ore., July 5, to celebrate at the northwest Oregon seashore town the anniversary of the division's first landing on an enemy beachhead during World War II.

Members of the unit will come from all over the United States to renew friendships and resurrect memories of the division's history-making South Pacific campaign, according to Art Fertig, Astoria, planning committee chairman.

The Pacific Ocean will be the headquarters for the three-day convention.

At the outset of World War II the division was one of the first units to be ordered overseas. Four years of heavy fighting took it from the Pacific Northwest to Australia, through the cauldron of New Guinea, back to the Philippines and then island hopping to Japan.

Often called "Uncle Sam's fighting division," the unit covered Idaho and Wyoming. Activities at the reunion will include a clam feed on the beach and off-shore

salmon fishing excursions, plus tours of the scenic northern Oregon coast. The former Camp Clatsop, the training base for the division's troops before they went overseas, is near the reunion site.

Memorial services to honor those who lost their lives in combat will be conducted Sunday.

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\$360,000 In Budget For County Forest Service Works

A sum of \$360,000 from the Accelerated Public Works program has been budgeted for 12 forest service projects in Klamath County during the past fiscal year, according to Congressman Ullman of the Second Congressional District.

Ullman said that of the amount

budgeted, \$337,688 had been obligated as of May 31. The Accelerated Public Works program provides for increased federal expenditures in areas of high unemployment, in order to help stimulate local economies.

Ullman said that unemployment is a serious problem in Klamath County, and expressed satisfaction that the congressional delegation had been able to obtain APW money. He added that the money spent not only provided

badly needed jobs, but allows accelerated work on important improvements in Oregon's forests. The projects for the county budgeted, and amounts obligated follows:

Daughters Deny Charge

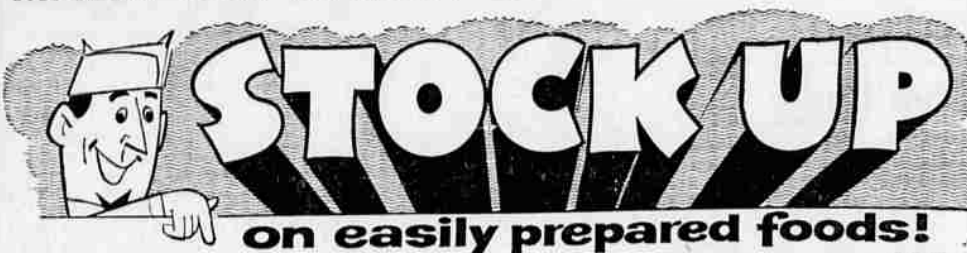
